# About The University

The year 1987 saw the beginning of the tectonic shift in perceptions about law as a career from one of the least attractive careers, to one of the most sought after, with the establishment of the National Law School, Bangalore. It was a time of hope for the legal fraternity. The concept of a national institution to act as a pace-setter and a testing ground for bold experiments in legal education came up before the Bar Council of India in the context of the Council's statutory responsibility for maintaining standards in professional legal education (under the Advocates Act).

**DR. RAM MANOHAR LOHIYA NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY** was established by an Act of Govt. of Uttar Pradesh in 2005, U.P. Act No. 28 of 2005 and came into being on 4th January, 2006 to meet up the new challenges in legal fields and to strengthen the vision that was given by the establishment of the first National Law School of the State of U.P. Originally incorporated as **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Institute, Uttar Pradesh**, the word 'Institute' was substituted by the 'University' later, vide an amendment in the Act in November, 2006. This was done to give a comprehensive national character to the institution on lines with the other premier National Law Universities of the country.

The University is committed to provide excellent infrastructural facilities and environment to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of law and legal process and to develop in the students and research scholars a sense of responsibility to serve the society in the field of law by developing skills in advocacy, judicial and other legal services and legislation and the like. The present law has to meet the requirements of the society and the challenges of the 21st Century. Law has to deal with problems of diverse magnitudes and a student of law and an Advocate has to be trained in Professional skills to meet the challenges of globalization and universalisation of law. With the advent of multinationals in India, as anywhere else, the task of lawyers would be highly technical and an imperative need would arise to have competent lawyers who would be trained in the right culture of Legal Education. This makes a sound case for introducing reforms in Legal Education; and we, at the Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University aim at all these aspects.

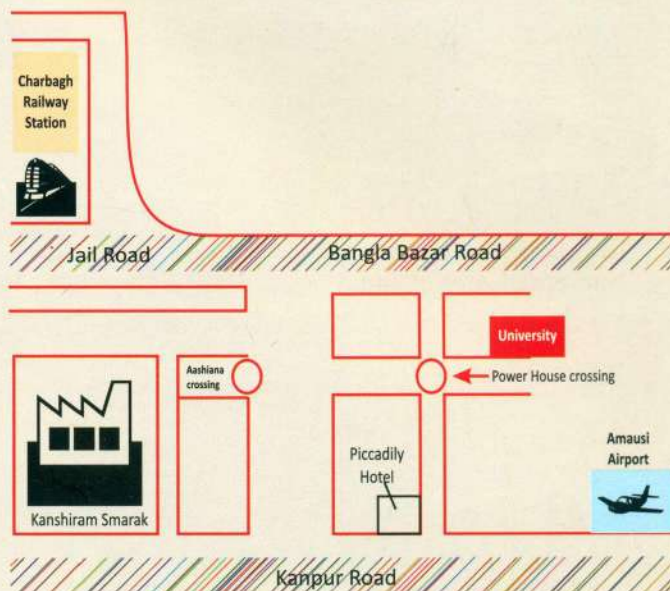

## LOCATION

Its strategic location is an important feature of the university. The university is on the equal distance from the main Railway Station, Charbagh and Amausi Airport. The distance is less than 5 kilometres from both the places. The university is situated in the State capital i.e. Lucknow and all the important State offices are within its reach.



## INFRASTRUCTURE

The university has the best infrastructure and all the three important pillars - Academic Block, Administrative Block and Library which are centrally air conditioned. There are certain plans to invite foreign participants and experts in future. Therefore, this support system will act as a positive factor in fulfilling the dreams of future.

### 1. DR. MADHU LIMAYE LIBRARY

The university has a very rich library in terms of quality and quantity of good books, journals, CD-ROMs and Online Databases. The library is full of good texts and reference books, almost all encyclopedias of social sciences and all national and international legal databases. The university also subscribes to more than 75 national and international journals. The library is also equipped with 60 computers for the research purposes and has comfortable sitting places for the students, faculty and researchers. Library housekeeping services are automated through LIBSYS Library automation software.

In the library itself, there are two training halls in which 40 participants can be trained in each hall. The university has video conferencing facilities as well. Library provides Online Public Access Catalogue (Web-OPAC), article indexing services. The Web-OPAC can be accessed through <http://192.168.1.3:8080/opac> within LAN service of the University. Library remains closed only on the three national holidays. From this year a new service of Books content sources has been introduced in the library which can be accessed through WEB-OPAC.

## **2. INTERNET FACILITIES**

At present university system has more than 100 computers and several laptops with the Faculty and the students. The computers are linked with the internet LAN facility and above all the whole campus is wi-fi enabled which gives an opportunity to each and every person on the campus to be connected with internet 24x7.

## **3. MOOT COURT HALL**

The moot court hall of the University can be said to be the best looking and technically most advanced moot court hall in the country.

## **4. SEMINAR HALL & AUDITORIUM**

The University has a seminar hall with a sitting capacity of 300. The University organizes most of the functions in the seminar hall. It has all the audio-video and presentation facilities. The auditorium with a capacity of 3500 persons is the largest auditorium of the city.

## **5. GUEST HOUSE**

The University has a fully furnished guest house offering the best facilities to the guests. At one point of time it can accommodate more than 60 persons. It has some VVIP and VIP suites also.

## **6. SPORTS & HEALTH CARE ACTIVITIES**

Sports activities and health care are also important aspects of the University. The University has all the necessary facilities for physical activities like sports complex, health centre and stadium. The campus also has a swimming pool.

## **7. COMMERCIAL COMPLEX**

The University is planned in such a manner that the things of daily use could be available to all the





persons in the campus itself. It has a small shopping complex in which shops for stationery, general items and food corner are available.

## **8. HOSTEL**

The University has three hostels, two for the boys and one for the girls. The overall capacity of all the hostel rooms is around 1500 students.

## **9. SECURITY**

The University has adequate infrastructure for the safety and security of the students, Faculty and Administrative Staff. Adequate arrangements have been provided for the safety of the persons living in the campus.

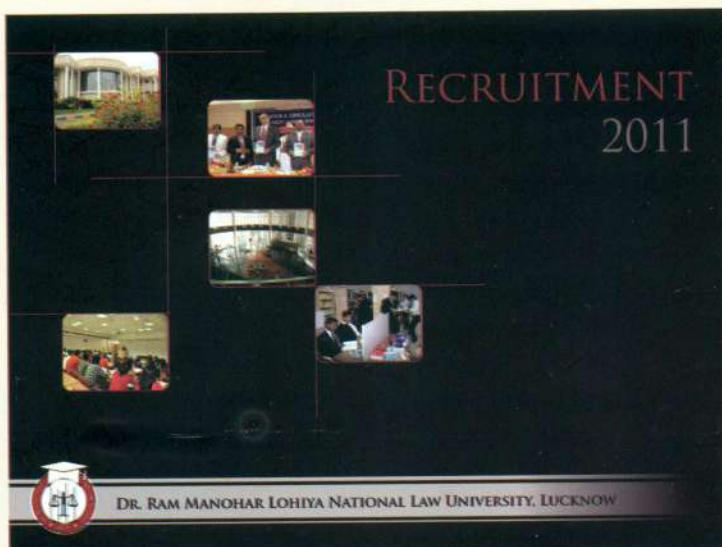

With this objective, the IPC ensures that during their summer and winter breaks, all the students are provided with the opportunities to work with different organizations and individuals in the field of law. The students have worked with reputed NGOs like PUCL, PUDR, CUTS, EHSAAAS, Action Aid, Oxfam, CHRI, VATSALYA, NBA, etc and have also undergone training in different State Human Rights Commissions and interned with leading law firms and lawyers in the country.

During the month of Dec-Jan in 2009-10, around 20 UG and PG students of this University participated in a month long Winter Human Rights Training Programme at this University, sponsored by the NHRC, New Delhi. The IPC has also started an internship programme for its students so as to give them an opportunity to work with senior Government Advocates at Allahabad High Court. This is a unique internship programme of its kind in India where students have opportunity to intern with Advocate General and Additional Advocate General(s).

Internships and short term trainings are ongoing process under the stewardship of this Committee and it has started showing its impact on the overall academic development of the students. The Committee has also started the process of organizing Pre-placement Talks by prospective recruiters and employers.

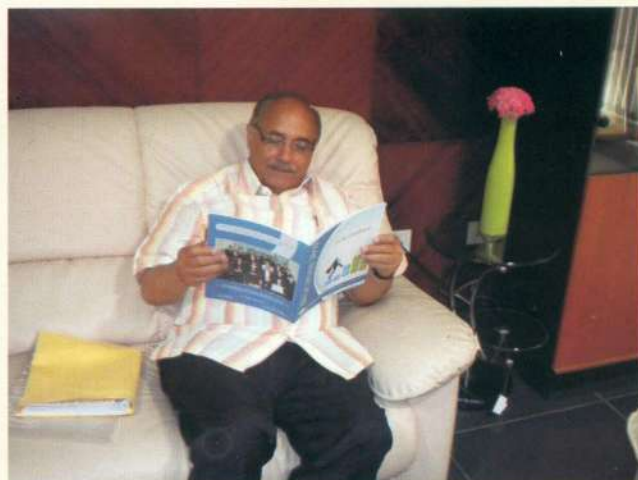

# An Analytical Study of Functioning of Prosecution System in State of Uttar Pradesh



## Project Sponsored by Department of Higher Education, Government of Uttar Pradesh under Centre of Excellence Scheme

Public Prosecutor has been described as a *minister of justice* who plays a critical role in maintaining purity and impartiality of criminal justice administration. As far back as 1928 the Patna High Court observed, “The purpose of a criminal trial is not to support at all costs a theory but to investigate the offence and to determine the fault or innocence of the accused, and the duty of the Public Prosecutor is to represent not the police but the Crown, and this duty should be discharged by him fairly and fearlessly and with full sense of responsibility that attaches to his position”.

The underlying principle governing the criminal justice system (CJS) is that all crimes (offences which have been codified as such in statutes) committed by an individual or group against others are deemed to have been committed against society. Consequently, the state takes action to prosecute the accused on behalf of, and in the interest of society. The Supreme Court of India observes, “Barring a few exceptions, in criminal matters, the party who is treated as aggrieved party is the state which is the custodian of the social interests of the community at large, and so it is for the state to take all steps necessary for bringing the person who has acted against the social interests of the community to book”. Thus the Public Prosecutor functions to protect and promote the community interest. *Is prosecution system performing this function effectively?*

The rationale behind the state undertaking prosecution is that no private person uses the legal apparatus to wreak private vengeance on anyone. The same principle has been reinforced also by the Supreme Court in the case *Thakur Ram vs. State of Bihar*. The state assuming the responsibility of prosecuting

the offender is thus viewed as a progression towards a more modern and civilized society where members do not indulge in private feuds to settle scores. *Is our prosecution able to avoid these pitfalls and uphold these intrinsic purposes?*

### Objectives of the Study

- To look into the organization and functioning of prosecution apparatus in the state of Uttar Pradesh.
- To assess the social, economic and professional background of prosecution officers.
- To examine financial and non-financial factors that facilitate functioning of Prosecution.
- To study forward and backward linkages with other sectors of criminal justice system.
- To ascertain the effectiveness of prosecution in prosecuting criminal cases.



### Expected Outcome

1. In-depth and incisive information about the organization and functioning of prosecution system in Uttar Pradesh
2. Data-based information on the factors that facilitate or impinge upon the functioning of prosecution in the state
3. Delineation of issues and problems of lateral and vertical coordination of the prosecution apparatus, with a view to upgrading the efficiency level of this criminal justice sector
4. Development of a road-map for improved and effective functioning of prosecution not only in Uttar Pradesh but also in other states and union territories.
5. Initiation of the process of dissemination of information on prosecution system in the state through booklets, website, etc.
6. Upscaling the efficiency / effectiveness of CJS in Uttar Pradesh

## Lecture on "Relevance of Forensic Psychology in Law" on August 13, 2010



Dr. Manas K.Mandal, Director, Defence Institute of Psychological Research, Ministry of Defence, New Delhi delivered a lecture on "Relevance of Forensic Psychology in Law" on August 13, 2010 in Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow.

Forensic psychology is the interface between psychology and the laws, so all psychological services provided for the legal community are forensic psychological services. However, most forensic psychologists provide services which are both clinical and forensic in nature. When a psychologist treats an individual who was emotionally traumatized by an accident, the treatment is clinical in nature, designed to assist the individual in recovering from the trauma. But, when the psychologist is asked to provide a report for the court, regarding the extent of the trauma, and to assess the psychological damage incurred, then the psychologist is providing forensic services.

In his opinion, the young generation will be leading and responsible for future development in sciences. He said deception is done through a non-verbal. A person can change 42000 facial expressions but normally we use only 200 expressions. Forensic psychology can be very helpful in cross examination of the witnesses. He added that psychopaths don't have a moral fiber. Real emotional expressions come only in the dreams otherwise in day time it is mostly imposed expressions.

The lecture was very useful and Prof. Balraj Chauhan and Prof. Manas K. Mandal expressed their interest in signing an MoU between the university and Defence Institute of Psychological Research. Professor Purnima Agarwal was the main coordinator of the programme.

# Mediation Programme - 2011

Mediation and Conciliation Centre, High Court in Collaboration with Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow organized a two days training programme from 21st-22nd August, 2010. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Markanday Katju, Judge, Supreme Court of India was the chief guest and inaugurated the workshop of Third Training of the Ist Batch at 9:30 am in the seminar hall of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow.



The event was inaugurated by Hon'ble Mr Justice Markandey Katju, Judge, Supreme Court of India. Event was presided over by Hon'ble Chief Justice F.I. Rebello, Chief Justice, Allahabad High Court. Speaking on this occasion everyone highlighted the growth and importance of mediation and the role of mediators. Justice D.P.Singh illustrated the role of lawyers as mediators which improves their role in public. They said that mediation keep intact the relationships and gives them the hope of surviving. ShriRam Panchu, Senior advocate Chennai and master mediator said that earlier the only way to solve



the dispute was to fight as warrior but now the scenario has changed and is shifting towards more peaceful and optimistic way. Chief Justice F.I. Rebello discussed about the high success rate in mediation center in Allahabad High court. Justice Katju stated the very recent case of mediation involving two states which would be happening for the first time in India. He also emphasized on the need of a better infrastructure for mediation and conciliation centre of high court bench at lucknow. Mr. I.B.Singh, Senior Advocate, High Court Lucknow Bench said that there is

no provision of anticipatory bail in the state of Uttar Pradesh and this is one reason that in some matters mediation is not successful. A book titled "Terrorism and Anti Terror Laws" edited by Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Dr. Mridul Srivastava and K.A.Pandey was also released on this occasion. The book is based on a discourse on terrorism and anti terror laws that took place in the university last year and includes the writings of eminent legal luminaries. The training program concluded on 22nd August 2010.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice D.P.Singh, while delivering his welcome address pointed out that disputes and confrontation between two parties can not be avoided but mediation can be very helpful in satisfying the parties.

Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice- Chancellor. Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University while delivering his welcome speech announced that Hon'ble Justice Markandey Katju has accepted to be an honorary professor of the university.

The theme for this years' lecture was "Anomalies in Law". In his lecture Justice raveendran identified three major anomalies in law and said that the biggest anomaly in law as perceived by a



common man is the judge himself. Justice Raveendran further added that lack of foresight and legal acumen on the part of legislative draftsman often leads to glaring anomalies in statutory law. Justice

Raveendran was of the opinion that even judicial decisions play their part in creating anomalies in law. He exhorted the young students of the law university present amongst the audience to take up the challenging task of identifying the different anomalies in different areas of law and prepare a report to be submitted to the law commission in this regard.

Hon'ble Mr Justice F.I.Rebello, Chief Justice, Allahabad High Court also touched upon the fascinating topic of anomalies in law and said that short of Judicial legislation, the judges should not hesitate in eliminating the anomalies in law through judicial craftsmanship. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Pradeep Kant, Senior Judge, Allahabad High Court also graced the occasion.

While welcoming the guest on university campus Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice-Chancellor, Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University emphasized that topic is just like an ocean and may be seen from different perspectives. One of the most characteristic features of the 20th century jurisprudence has been the development of sociological approach to law. Law is a product of numerous factors – social, economic, political and cultural. The social context of law is of immense significance. Emphasis of the function of law as an instrument for serving the needs of society and Justice may mean different things to different minds at different times.

## International Seminar to commemorate 150th anniversary of the IPC, 1860



The Centre for Criminal Justice Administration at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow organized an International Seminar on Relevance of the Indian Penal Code in Controlling and Combating Crime in Modern Age, from December 14-15, 2010, commemorating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

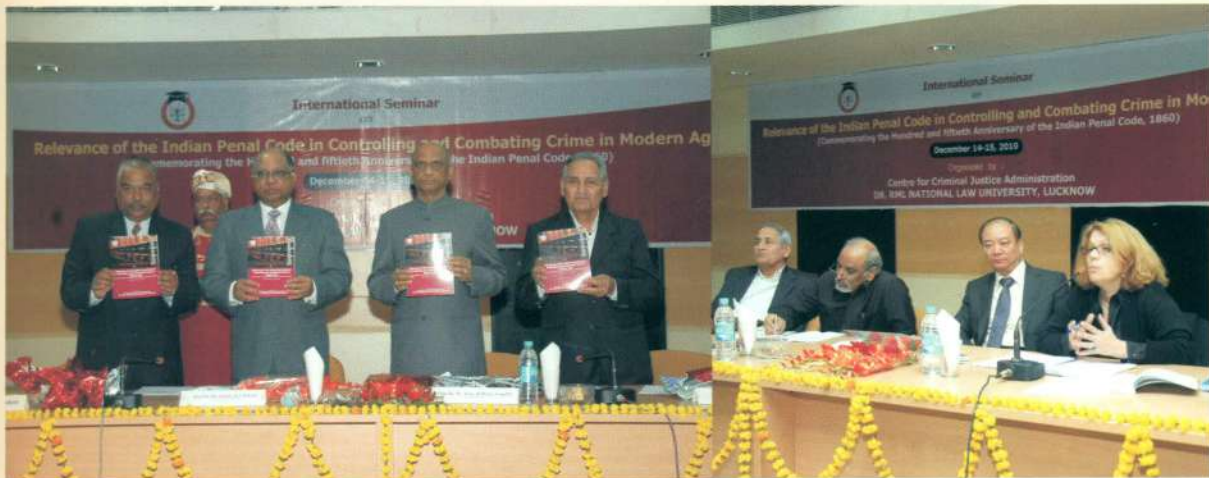
The inauguration ceremony was held on the morning of 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2010 and the chief guest for the august occasion, **F. I. Rebello, Chief Justice of the Allahabad High Court**, marked the beginning of





his address with a brief discussion of the history of the Indian Penal Code and how it came to be drafted by Lord Macaulay and amended several times since. The Code completed its 150 years of existence on 6th October 2010 and is thus celebrating its 150th anniversary this year. He remarked as to how the robust Act, which is one of the rock-beds of criminal jurisprudence in our country, is also among the oldest surviving criminal laws in the world – a most comprehensive and admirable compilation of substantive criminal law. In his opinion, what remains the main beauty of this code is the fact that most of its provisions are as suitable today as they were when enacted in 1860 A.D. He commended the drafting and far sightedness of Lord Macaulay who single handedly drafted this masterpiece which has stood the test of time. In days when the concept of individualization of punishment was totally unconceived, it defined offences and prescribed separate punishment for each. However, he cautioned that the Indian penal code is not a modern code in every sense of the term. In fact, it requires little change to meet the aims and aspirations of contemporary society with emphasis on penology having shifted from punitive deterrence to reformation and correction. He congratulated the Vice-Chancellor, faculty members and patrons of this seminar and students of the University which, he noted, has taken a long stride in the field of legal education in a very short time. He expressed his hope that the discussions that will take place in the seminar and with the opinions of foreign scholars present here, we will have





some new ideas for reform and the lacunae in the code can easily be filled and this Code will become a modern law in the real sense.

Presiding over the inaugural ceremony was **Mr. Rakesh Dhar Tripathi, Cabinet Minister for Higher Education, Government of Uttar Pradesh**. The distinguished Minister laid emphasis on enacting an indigenous penal code as the current Indian Penal Code in force is of colonial origin which was imposed upon the subcontinent to enslave Indians and to suppress and punish rebels. He requested present jurist to come up with a nationalized IPC which shall reflect the State's policy of welfare for people and should not just follow the antique British Law. Law should not be simply for punishment but primarily for welfare and upliftment of the people and should reflect in the enacted codes as well as the law as practiced in the courts. He also extended support on

behalf of the Government to the University and was happy to be among the distinguished scholars and dignitaries.

**Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice Chancellor of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University** and a distinguished scholar of Criminal Law and Criminology, discussed how criminal law can be compared to a tree. A Tree has 3 parts – root, shoot and leaves. Similarly, the IPC has also been divided into 3 parts - root being the notions and principles, shoot being the doctrines and leaves being specific offences. IPC is socially relevant. There are certain tests to determine whether any criminal law is fulfilling its functions and is a good law. Firstly, we must see whether it is able to maintain public order. Secondly, it must provide sufficient safeguards, especially to those who are weak. Thirdly, it must protect the society from criminal activities.

**Eminent scholar Prof. B. B. Pande** discussed the relevance of IPC in today's age and said that the provisions of IPC like (302, 303) have been challenged because of the Constitution which was not there in 1860 and therefore because of the rule of law and constitutional practice. He laid emphasis on the fact that we will have to check whether the provisions of IPC are relevant even today or not.



The first plenary session was chaired and co-chaired by Prof. B. B. Pande and Prof. M. Zakaria, former Dean, AMU, Aligarh. The first speaker was **Prof. Kam C. Wong, Xavier University, USA** who is basically from the field of sociology of law and a former policeman in China and shared his views on policing. He shared his theories on policing which he has devised after 20 years of study and experience. He also pointed out how resourceful people do not report matters to the police and the most important such resource is education. He emphasized that the closest person should solve people's problems and police should be a last resort. The police first tries to solve a person's problem, even by bending the law, rather than solving a crime.

**Prof. K. I. Vibhute, Darussalam University, Brunei**, shared his experiences and observations of policing and the criminal justice administration in South Africa. **Prof. Jianhong Liu, Professor and Chair, University of Macau**, threw light upon the contemporary Chinese criminal justice



administration and the largely punitive nature of the same while also elaborating upon the changing trend and the increasing inclination towards mediation mechanism, probation and parole, community based corrections and other restorative measures. He also explained the marvel and relevance of Confucian legal thinking and its affect on the Chinese legal system till date.



**Prof. Sylvie Cimmomonti, Dept. Of Criminal Justice, France**, gave a taste of the European legal system. She explained to the eager gathering the evolution of the penal codes of France and the latest development regarding the law of preventive detention.

Post lunch, in the second plenary session, Prof. B. B. Pande, in his speech, emphasized upon putting meticulous effort for revising the IPC and also talked of balancing of the scales of justice. He talked about the historical background of the code and the intention of the colonists. His address was followed by a speech by Prof. Faizan Mustafa, Vice Chancellor, National Law University, Orissa, who talked about the Malimath Committee report which was based on the premise of de-humanization of the IPC. He went on to point out that the abuse of power by the courts, the spokesmen of the state, who have been very harsh lately.

The evening concluded with a cultural program by the students of Bhatkhande.



## Lecture on Community Policing



Dr. RML National Law University organised an Interaction of Senior Police Officers of U.P. on Community Policing on 16.12.2010. Professor Kam C. Wong of Xavier University U.S.A and Prof. G.S.bajpai were the main resource persons. The interaction was focused on how to bring community



closer to the police and how can police officers find a better way to handle the situation to regulate law and order in the society. At this occasion the Vice-Chancellor of DRMLNLU Professor Balraj Chauhan said that the police must use the Police Regulation Act 1861 for preserving the public order. He also suggested that the police also require a proper direction to channelise their functions now a days.

Speaking at the moment Mr. Sul Khan Singh A.D.G. (Training) raised the issue "why community policing is not taking place in India?" Further he said that it is a matter of heart rather than brain and the police has been trained to use their brains not the hearts. At this occasion the Hon'ble Chief Guest Professor Kam C. Wong said that police is an institution and community policing is a matter of heart not the brain. He said that it has to be legal justice in one hand and public justice on the other. Both police and public must have mutual understanding.

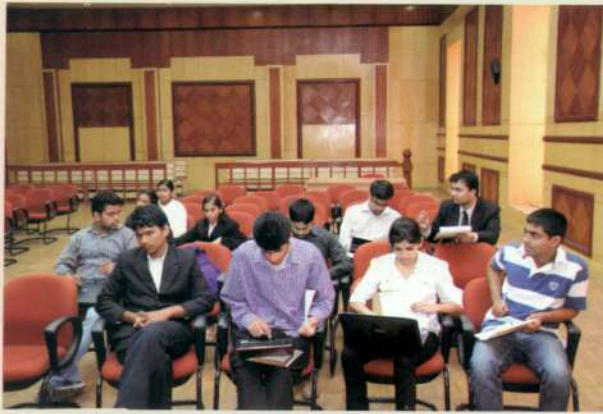

Mr. Lov Verma, IAS, Member Secretary, NCPCR expressed hope that the Consultation will come up with some fruitful suggestions and recommendations which shall pave way of strengthening the proposed Bill so that when it is enacted in law, it is workable and reflects our commitment towards protection of children from all forms of abuse including sexual abuse.

Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice- Chancellor, RMLNLU, spoke about the background of the consultative process and underlined its importance in the law making process.



Prof. K.A. Pandey, Coordinator of the North Region Consultations, presented a detailed overview of the proposed Bill highlighting the areas of concern and controversy.

During the technical sessions, some very useful and radical suggestions were made by the distinguished participants, in the areas of punishment, consent, rehabilitation, prosecution and compensation aspects of the proposed Bill.

The Bill is likely to be introduced in the Parliament in the coming Monsoon session. The Recommendations and suggestions emerging from the North Region Consultation will form part of the recommendations which the NCPCR intends to submit to the government after the nation-wide consultative process is over.

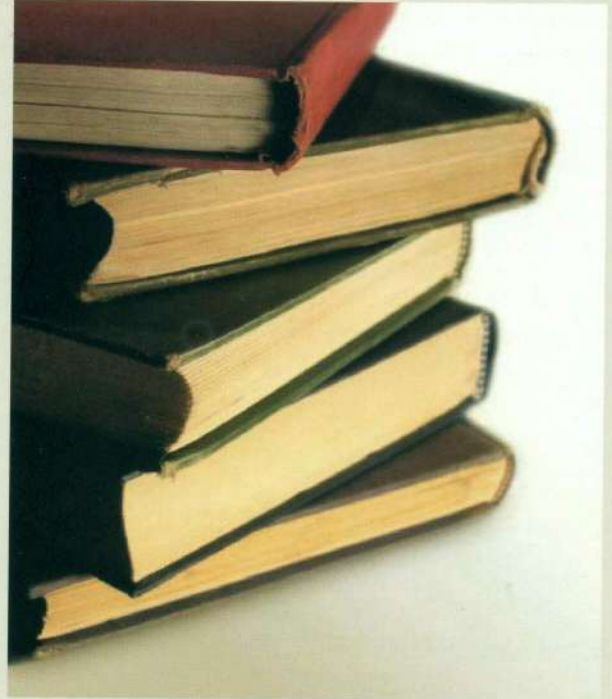
