

About *The University*

The year 1987 saw the beginning of the tectonic shift in perceptions about law as a career from one of the least attractive careers, to one of the most sought after, with the establishment of the National Law School, Bangalore. It was a time of hope for the legal fraternity. The concept of a national institution to act as a pace-setter and a testing ground for bold experiments in legal education came up before the Bar Council of India in the context of the Council's statutory responsibility for maintaining standards in professional legal education (under the Advocates Act).

DR. RAM MANOHAR LOHIYA NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY was established by an Act of Legislature of Uttar Pradesh in 2005, U.P. Act No. 28 of 2005 and came into being on 4th January, 2006 to meet up the new challenges in legal fields and to strengthen the vision that was given by the establishment of the first National Law School of the State of U.P. Originally incorporated as **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Institute, Uttar Pradesh**, the word 'Institute' was substituted by the 'University' later, vide an amendment in the Act in November, 2006. This was done to give a comprehensive national character to the institution on lines with the other premier National Law Universities of the country.

The University is committed to provide excellent infrastructural facilities and environment to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of law and legal process and to develop in the students and research scholars a sense of responsibility to serve the society in the field of law by developing skills in advocacy, judicial and other legal services and legislation and the like. The present law has to meet the requirements of the society and the challenges of the 21st Century. Law has to deal with problems of diverse magnitudes and a student of law and an Advocate has to be trained in Professional skills to meet the challenges of globalization and universalisation of law. With the advent of multinationals in India, as anywhere else, the task of lawyers would be highly technical and an imperative need would arise to have competent lawyers who would be trained in the right culture of Legal Education. This makes a sound case for introducing reforms in Legal Education; and we, at the Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University aim at all these aspects.

About the *Vice-Chancellor*



The former Head of the Faculty of Law at Delhi University, Prof. Gurdip Singh has taken the charge as the Vice Chancellor of Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University (RMLNLU), Lucknow on 03-05.2013. Singh replaces Prof. Balraj Chauhan, who had completed his tenure in January 2013. Prof. Singh has completed B.Sc LL.B. LL.M. and Ph.D. from Delhi University. Prof. Singh has more than thirty-five years of experience, joining Delhi University as a Lecturer in 1977. He was made a Reader in 1985 and promoted as a Professor in 1995. In 2010, he took charge as Head and Dean of Faculty of Law.

Some of the ambitious plans of Prof. Singh include:

1. Signing MoUs with leading foreign universities for exchange of faculties, exchange of students on the basis of reciprocity, joint research projects and then collaborations in holding International conferences
2. Intensifying the placement network for the benefit of the students and not only placements with reputed law firms in India but also with foreign law firms”. “Internships also need to be taken care of”,
3. Organising not only National moot courts but also International moot court where teams from almost all countries should come and participate”.
4. Organizing weekly seminars where teachers will present papers by way of rotation which will further strengthen teaching skills and regular training workshops for teachers in various areas”.

His mission is to achieve excellence in teaching as well as research and to bring the University to a global level and make it a leading university for imparting legal teaching and research. Prof. Singh was associated with 5-year law schools for a long time. He has been member of General Council at NLIU Bhopal. He is an Executive Member at RGNUL, Patiala. He has been associated with NLU Delhi. He is well aware of the functioning of five-year law schools. Prof. Singh is an expert in the field of International Law and Environmental law.

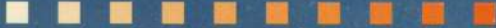

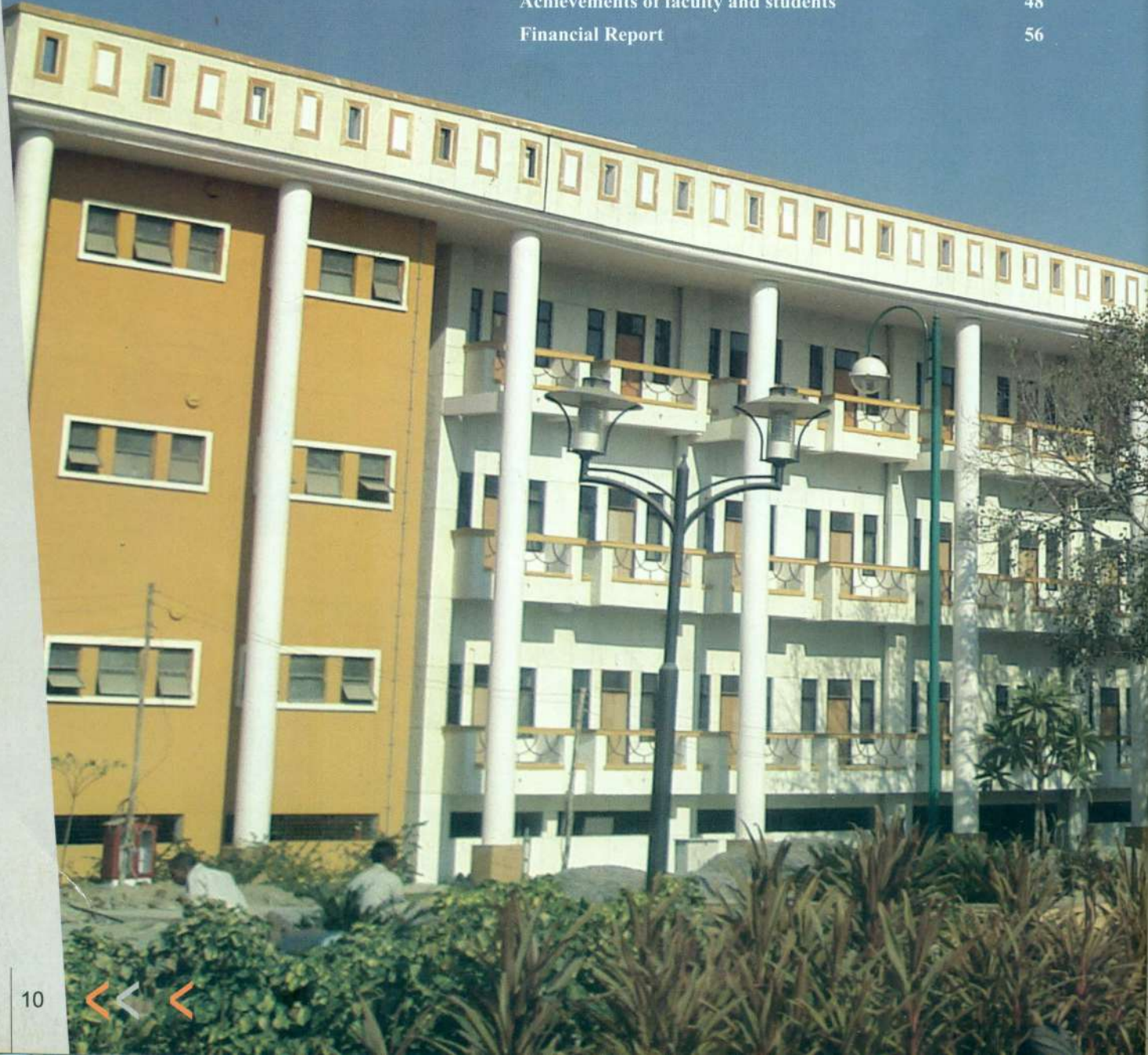

1. DR. MADHU LIMAYE LIBRARY

The university has a very rich library in terms of quality and quantity of good books, journals, CD-ROMs and Online Databases. The library is full of good texts and reference books, almost all encyclopedias of social sciences and all national and international legal databases. The university also subscribes to more than 75 national and international journals. The library is also equipped with 60 computers for the research purposes and has comfortable sitting places for the students, faculty and researchers. Library housekeeping services are automated through LIBSYS Library automation software.

In the library itself, there are two training halls in which 40 participants can be trained in each hall. The university has video conferencing facilities as well. Library provides Online Public Access Catalogue (Web-OPAC), article indexing services. The Web-OPAC can be accessed through LAN service of the University. Library remains closed only on the three national holidays. From this year a new service of Books content sources has been introduced in the library which can be accessed through WEB-OPAC.

The Internship and Placement Committee

It is very necessary that the theoretical discussions in the classrooms must be supplemented with practical exposure to legal environment. The Legal Aid Committee

Activities: 2012-13



Introduction

The Legal Aid Committee of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University is a Committee formed under the directives of National Legal Services Authority and is in spirit with Article 39 (A) of the Constitution of India. The Committee was inaugurated by Mr. Arijit Pasayat, hon'ble judge of Supreme Court of India and Chairman of the SCLSC on 21st February, 2009 and is first of its kind in the state of Uttar Pradesh. The Committee started functioning under the name "Dastagir" and with the motto of "Aiding the Unaided" in 2009.

The aims and objectives of the Committee are mentioned in the Preamble of the Constitution which reads as follows:

"We the members of the Legal Aid Committee of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow in order to establish justice and to promote the general welfare shall strive to shoulder the responsibility of marshalling the force of law and our strength as students of law to combat the causes of delayed justice.

We shall endeavour to propogate as well as make the noble cause of "aiding the unaided" functional.

We shall enterprise to enlighten the beacon of social justice and legal awareness by empowering the student community.

We shall strive to bring about sensitivity in the approach of the society.

We shall ensure that legal awareness is precipitated too ground level.

We shall endeavour to ensure that approach of judiciary is more sensitive about their accountability as the trustees of justice.

We shall endeavour to judiciously exploit the potential and dynamism of the legal services act, which can be instrumental in redressing the grievances of the society in an effective and competent way.

Our objective shall be to contextualize functionality of law from the standpoint of a law student and to usher sensitivity in the student community regarding the problems of the society and making them active partners in such social service"

The Legal Aid Committee of RMLNLU strives to achieve the above objectives and provide pro bono legal assistance to those who cannot afford it and has organized various legal aid camps to promote the same. The Committee works to spread legal awareness amongst the common masses and has undertaken various competitions, projects, conferences, and seminars in areas of child rights, RTIs and Mediation. A national Mediation Competition was conducted by the RMLNLU Legal Aid Committee in January, 2012 first of its kind in India. It has taken up a Initiative to Spread awareness about the Right





to Information Act, 2005 and organized various RTI workshops in various schools of Lucknow. The Committee has taken up various projects to promote legal awareness and legal education and strives to make law and legal process instruments of social development. The Committee firmly believed that a right to free legal aid is the constitutional right of the weaker sections of society and makes all endeavours to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities.

Our Activities:

The Legal Aid Committee since its initiation has dedicated itself to not only a lot of legal and social welfare activities but also to taking the initiatives for organizing the RMLNLU National 1st Mediation Competition in 2012 the first of its kind in the country.

Following is the list of activities we conducted during 2012-13 session:

- A Health and Hygiene Camp was organized at Rays of Joy Orphanage. Another free eye surgery camp was also conducted where glasses were distributed and free eye tests conducted.
- One of the most important events conducted by the LAC was a Legal Aid and Awareness camp at the **Maha Kumbh Mela** 2012 in Allahabad, the largest human gathering on Earth.
- RTI workshops were conducted in Lucknow between various groups of people like in Lucknow Public School, New Public School, 30th NCC Girls Battalion and even Fighting Four Guards Unit at RMLNLU, G.D. Goenka School in Agra and St. Joseph College, Allahabad.
- Another successful **Legal Aid Camp** was held at Prasad Institute of Technology, Banthara on 25/12/2011 from 10:00am to 1:00pm by the RMLNLU Legal Aid Committee. It was attended by around 150 people who had some kind of legal issues. In total 88 applications were drafted & forwarded to the **State Legal Services Authority (SLSA)** for further actions. A general briefing about Consumer Protection Laws, Protection against Domestic Violence Act, dowry, rights of the accused, laws governing pension policies for widows, senior citizens etc., laws relating to insurance, civil and criminal offences, benefits of using Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) as a mode of dispute redressal, relief available under the Legal Services Authority Act etc. was done.
- A **National Mediation Competition** was conducted by the RMLNLU Legal Aid Committee in January, 2012 first of its kind in India
- Secured **paralegal training** for more than 70 students of the university at **National Legal Services Authority** and more than 50 students at **Uttar Pradesh State Legal Services Authority**.

The Legal Aid Committee also stays in constant touch with the State Legal Services Authority and is grateful for the support rendered and the faith shown by SLSA. The Legal Aid Committee looks forward to organizing more such mediation competitions and camps in the future.



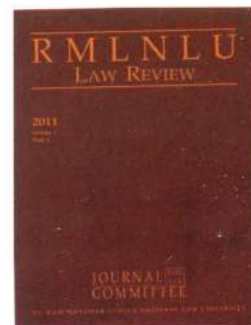
Journal Committee

- The Journal is multidisciplinary, so articles on the recent developments in law generally receive preference.
- Students pursuing the undergraduate and post-graduate students are allowed to send in submissions.
- At present we have a student review model for evaluation of the articles for the Journal.
- Rolling submissions are not allowed.

Eos – 2012



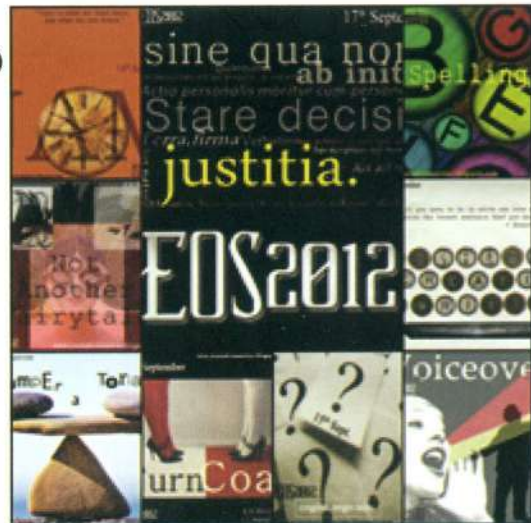

The competition also received the patronage of and commendation from the President of the IISL, Dr. (Mrs.) Tanja Masson-Zwaan, also the Honorary Head of the Executive Panel of Judges.

- ii. Commercial Activities in Outer Space
- iii. Disaster Management in Outer Space

Prospective Projects

Listed below are some of the proposed events and activities the Committee hopes to bring to fruition in the upcoming academic year.

1. Legal Writing Workshop for Students at RMLNLU

Two separate workshops, one for first years and another for senior batches, catering to the different needs of the two. The Committee wishes to invite experienced persons to conduct the workshop and guide the students in the art of legal writing.

The RMLNLU Law Review requires contacts with experts in various fields who may help and guide in the process of selection of the articles of the Journal to improve its quality. The setting up of a Peer Review Board is, thus, of utmost importance.

5. Convenors'/Editors' conclave for law colleges/universities in India.

Most law colleges/universities have law reviews run by the student editorial team. A conclave of the Convenors of these teams will help in developing and improving methods of evaluation, and to cultivate a more productive and cooperative environment in the field of student level legal research and writing.

Events organized by Moot Court Committee

The Moot Court Committee at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University is a student body that is responsible for organizing and administering moot activities in the university. A moot court is a simulated court proceeding, which usually involves drafting briefs (or memorials) and participating in oral arguments. The Moot Court Committee's role is to facilitate and regulate moot activities at the University.

The Moot Court Committee's primary job is to select teams to represent the University at various National and International Moots. For this the MCC organizes the University Moot Court Selections (UMCS) also known as the Grand Intra, in the month of September, and, the Mini Grand Intra, in the month of February. A pool of all the moots on the annual moot calendar is created and allocated to the participating teams in the order of their ranks and preferences. This year's Grand Intra witnessed participation from 40 teams. A team comprising of Neel Kamal Mishra, Shantanu Singh and Charul Dudi won the Grand Intra. A total of 6 teams participated the Mini Grand Intra. A team comprising of Divyangna Garg, Ruchir Ranjan Rai and K Kaushik won the Mini Grand Intra. The MCC also organizes Open Challenges and separate selection rounds for prestigious international moots like Stetson International Environmental Moot Court Competition, Oxford Media Law International Moot Court Competition, Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition, Manfred Lachs International Space Law Moot Court Competition etc.

The MCC is also entrusted with the responsibility of developing future mooters, as well as an interest in moot activities. In pursuance of this, the MCC follows a policy of encouraging participation in moot activities from all batches, especially the first years. To allow them to compete on an equal footing and groom them for the future, the MCC organizes extensive workshops and demonstrations to enable them to learn the process of moot activities from the very basics to the most intricate details. The Moot Court Committee also organizes a fresher's moot, called 'Concours', exclusively for the First Year students, so as to learn and grasp the skills involved in moot activities. Further, the MCC arranges for interactive sessions with experienced Mooters from senior batches to guide the present Mooters better.

Apart from conducting selection proceedings the committee is tasked with providing any and all assistance which a moot team may require for eg. situations where the need for changing the composition of an already selected team arises, the MCC functions according to a well devised mechanism for induction and screening of the new member. Moreover, for the convenience of the teams who represent the university, in dealing with the administration for the purposes of registration, reimbursement etc, one member of the Committee is assigned per team, called the Team Liaison.

The Committee is proud to have successfully organized the college's first Flagship moot court competition in association with Eastern Book Company and SCC Online this year. The event aimed at exploring the emerging facet of Media Law received widespread participation from Universities all across the country and was widely recognized as a huge success.

Students of Dr. RMLNLU, Lucknow have shown consistency in their excellence in National as well as International Moot Court competitions. Besides winning several competitions, and a few being the first Indian team to do so, the Moot Court Committee of the University organized the 1st RMLNLU SCC Online Media Law Moot Court Competition in April 2013. The academic year 2012-2013 has



been an excellent year for RMLNLU in terms of mootings. The college has performed consistently well at various prestigious National and International law Moot Court Competitions. Some of the significant achievements are as follows:

The team also won the **4th Best Memorial** and the **Spirit of Surana Awards**. The team also represented India at the International Rounds of the Competition held in Washington DC in April.
- II. The team comprising of **Roli Sharma, Smriti Punnoose and Shradha Rakhecha** won the **Surana and Surana North India Rounds of Stetson International Environmental Moot Court Competition** organised at National Law Institute University, Bhopal from 30 November-02 December, 2012. **Ms Smriti Punnoose** was adjudged as the **3rd Best Oralist**. The team also won the **3rd Best Memorial Award**. Along with three other teams, the team will now represent India at the International Rounds of the Competition, to be held in Florida in March. The team also brought laurels in the International Rounds held at Florida from 21-23 March, 2013 by finishing as Semi Finalists, 2nd best memorial and Smriti and Roli securing the 5th and 6th best speakers.
- III. 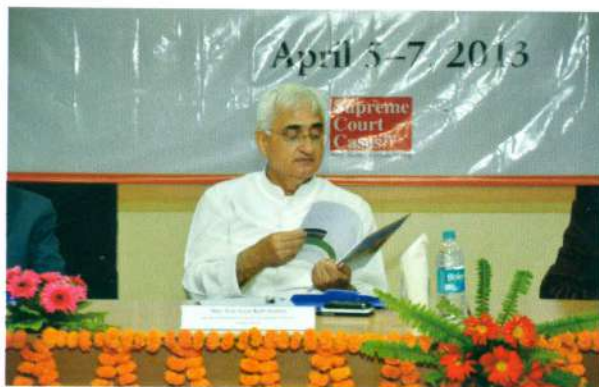
Release of the Report on "Prosecution System in the State of Uttar Pradesh" on 28.12.2012

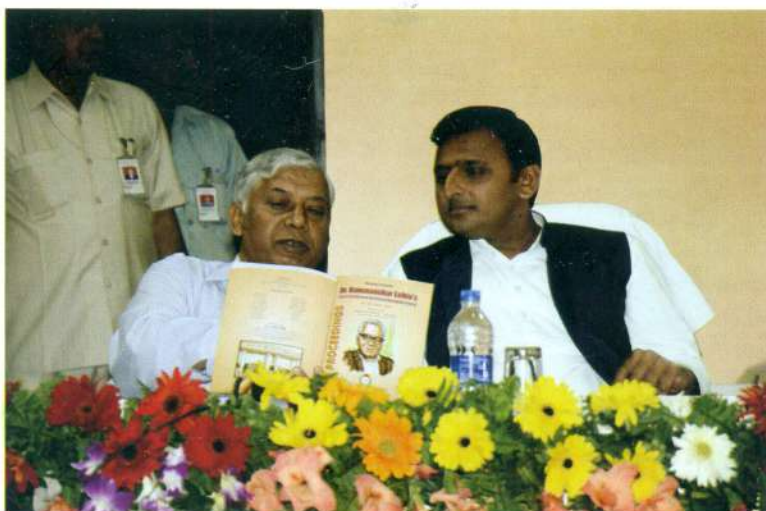
NLU MUN Awards ceremony:

Surplus funds of university, particularly pertaining to fees accounts have been invested in FDR with Nationalized Banks and are properly reflected in books of accounts.

Fixed Assets

Since Construction of the University building is being done by UP Rajkiya Nirman Nigam, details of building wise expenditure along with assets procured & transferred to university has not been received, where by capitalization of assets is yet to be done.

It is suggested that complete inventory details of items provided by M/s Rajkiya Nirman Nigam Ltd. be sought from them where by. Fixed Assets register can be maintained. Further all fixed assets are numbered and also physically verified at the end of each year.

Depreciation on Fixed Assets

Depreciation on assets purchased by University has been charged as per Income Tax Act,1961 to ascertain their proper value.

However Depreciation on Assets provided by M/s Rajkiya Nirman Nigam Ltd. has not been charged in absence of detailed valuation of Assets provided by them.
