## ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

The year 1987 saw the beginning of the tectonic shift in perceptions about law as a career from one of the least attractive careers, to one of the most sought after, with the establishment of the National Law School, Bangalore. It was a time of hope for the legal fraternity. The concept of a national institution to act as a pace-setter and a testing ground for bold experiments in legal education came up before the Bar Council of India in the context of the Council's statutory responsibility for maintaining standards in professional legal education (under the Advocates Act).

**DR. RAM MANOHAR LOHIYA NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY** was established by an Act of Govt. of Uttar Pradesh in 2005, U.P. Act No. 28 of 2005 and came into being on 4th January, 2006 to meet up the new challenges in legal fields and to strengthen the vision that was given by the establishment of the first National Law School of the State of U.P. Originally incorporated as **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Institute, Uttar Pradesh**, the word 'Institute' was substituted by the 'University' later, vide an amendment in the Act in November, 2006. This was done to give a comprehensive

national character to the institution on lines with the other premier National Law Universities of the country.

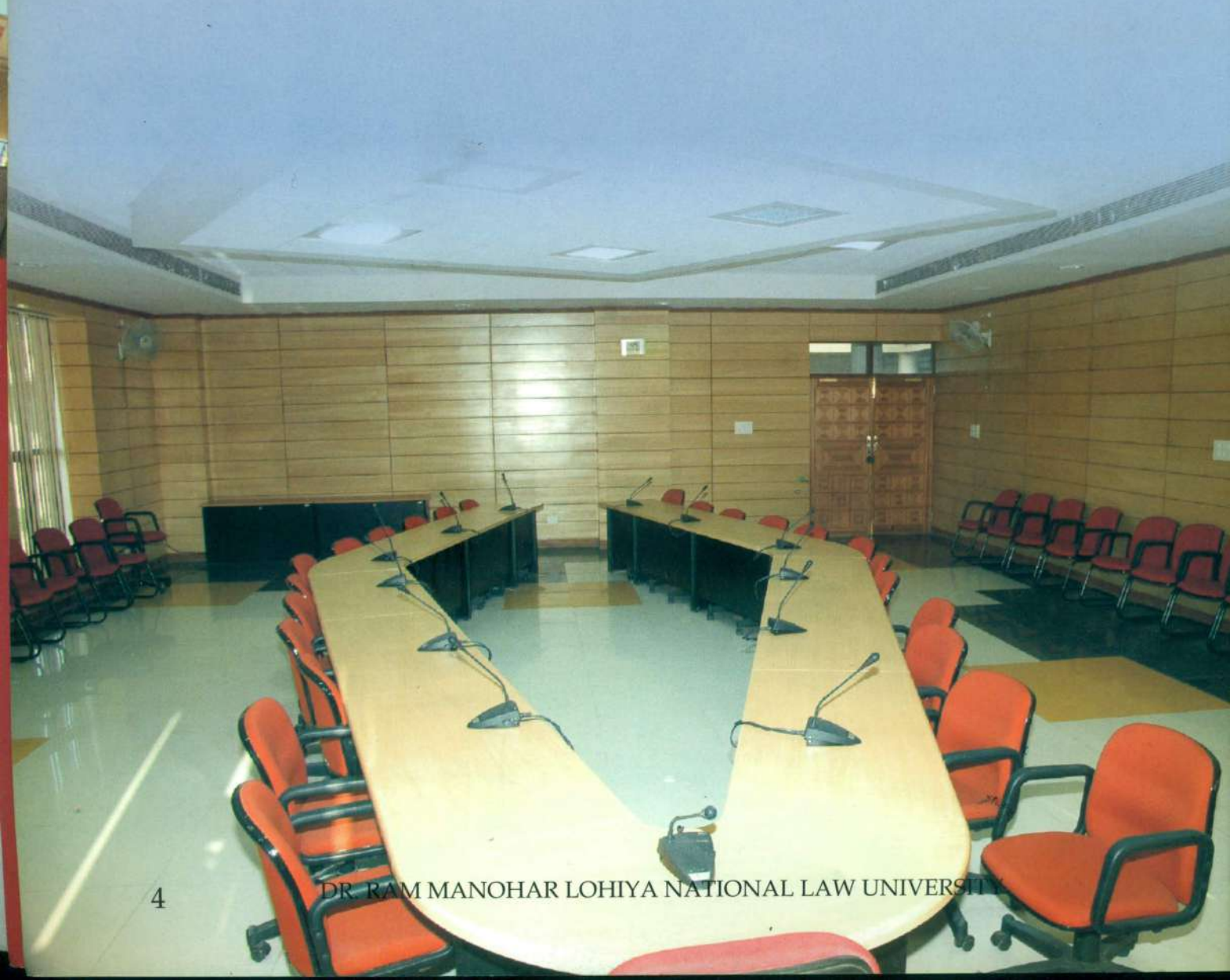

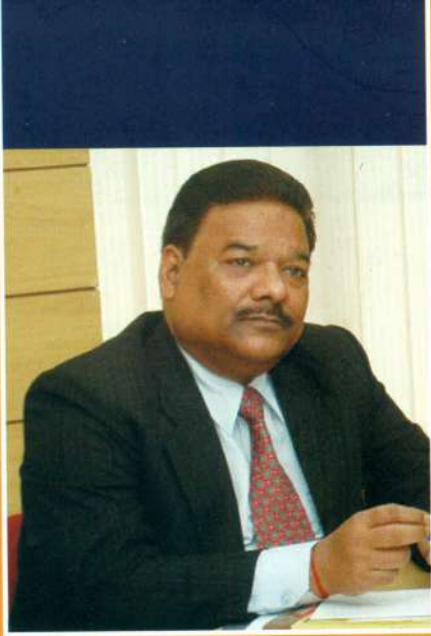
## MESSAGE FROM THE PLANNING TEAM

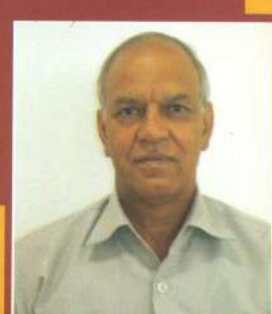

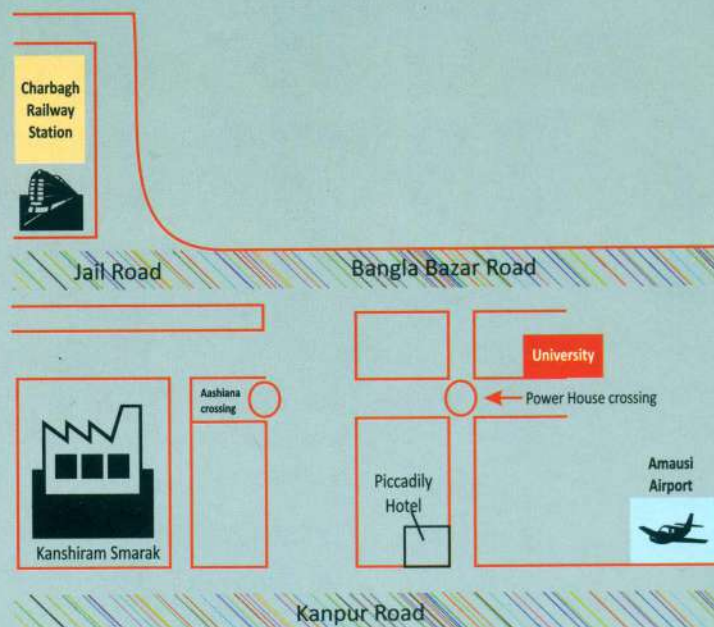

## LOCATION

Its strategic location is an important feature of the university. The university is on the equal distance from the main Railway Station, Charbagh and Amousi Airport. The distance is less than 5 kilometres from both the places. The university is situated in the State capital i.e. Lucknow and all the important State offices are within its reach.



## INFRASTRUCTURE

The university has the best infrastructure and all the three important pillars - Academic Block, Administrative Block and Library which are centrally air conditioned. There are certain plans to invite foreign participants and experts in future. Therefore, this support system will act as a positive factor in fulfilling the dreams of future.

### 1. DR. MADHU LIMAYE LIBRARY

The university has a very rich library in terms of quality and quantity of good books, journals, CD-ROMs and Online Databases. The library is full of good texts and reference books, almost all encyclopedias of social sciences and all national and international legal databases. The university also subscribes to more than 75 national and international journals. The library is also equipped with 60 computers for the research purposes and has comfortable sitting places for the students, faculty and researchers. Library housekeeping services are automated through LIBSYS Library automation software.

In the library itself, there are two training halls in which 40 participants can be trained in each hall. The university has video conferencing facilities as well. Library provides Online Public Access Catalogue (Web-OPAC), article indexing services. The Web-OPAC can be accessed through <http://192.168.1.3:8080/opac> within LAN service of the University. Library remains closed only on the three national holidays. From this year a new service of Books content sources has been introduced in the library which can be accessed through WEB-OPAC.

## 2. INTERNET FACILITIES

At present university system has more than 100 computers and several laptops with the Faculty and the students. The computers are linked with the internet LAN facility and above all the whole campus is wi-fi enabled which gives an opportunity to each and every person on the campus to be connected with internet 24x7.

The University has a fully furnished guest house offering the best facilities to the guests. At one point of time it can accommodate more than 60 persons. It has some VVIP and VIP suites also.





## **6. SPORTS & HEALTH CARE ACTIVITIES**

Sports activities and health care are also important aspects of the University. The University has all the necessary facilities for physical activities like sports complex, health centre and stadium. The campus also has a swimming pool.

## **7. COMMERCIAL COMPLEX**

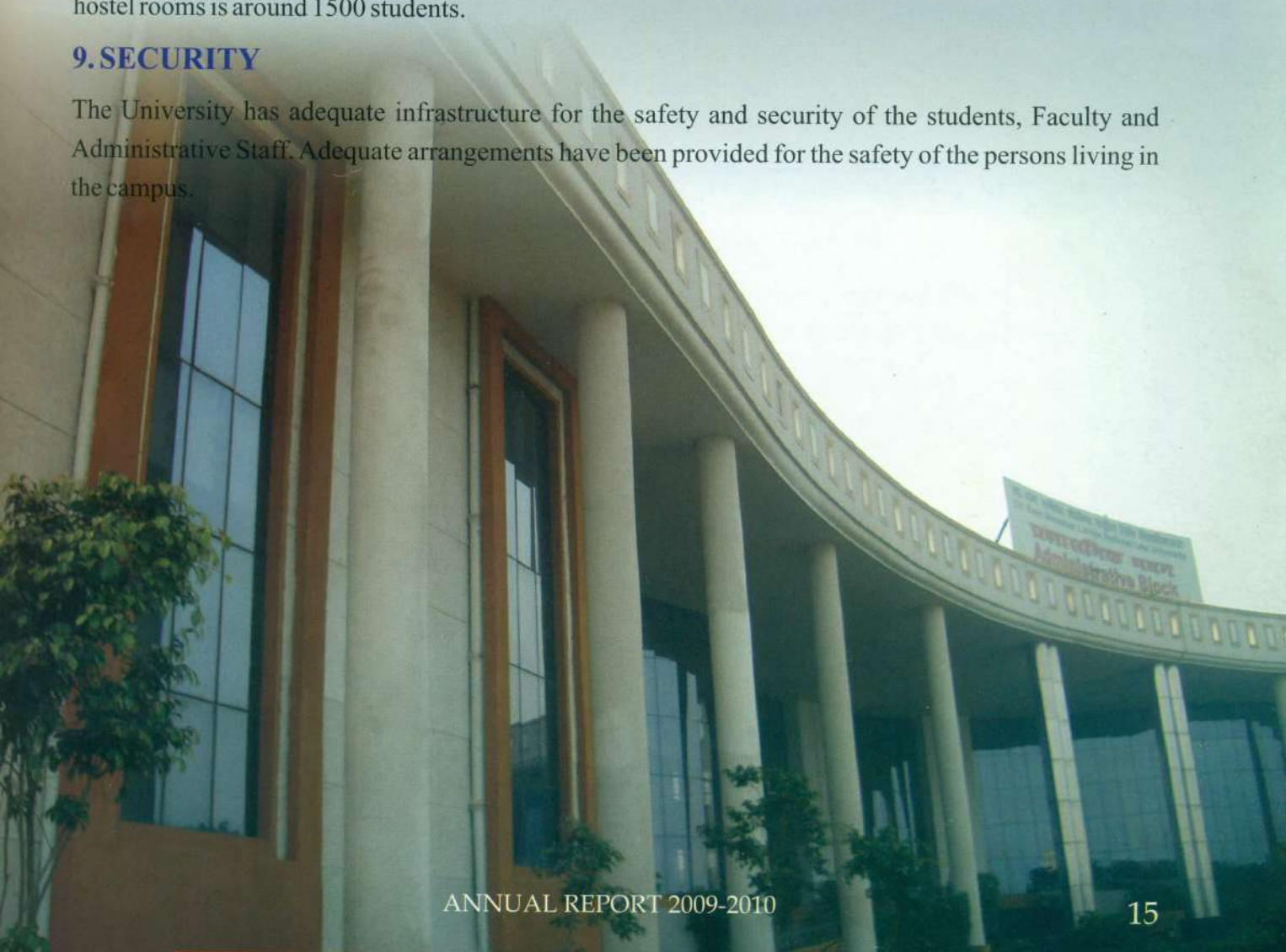
The University is planned in such a manner that the things of daily use could be available to all the persons in the campus itself. It has a small shopping complex in which shops for stationery, general items and food corner are available.

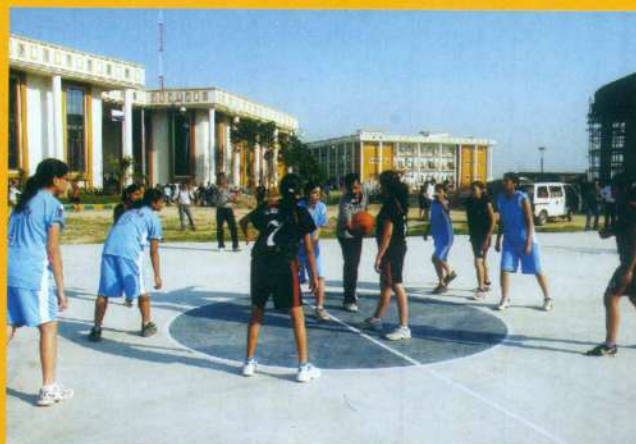

# THE INTERNSHIP AND PLACEMENT COMMITTEE

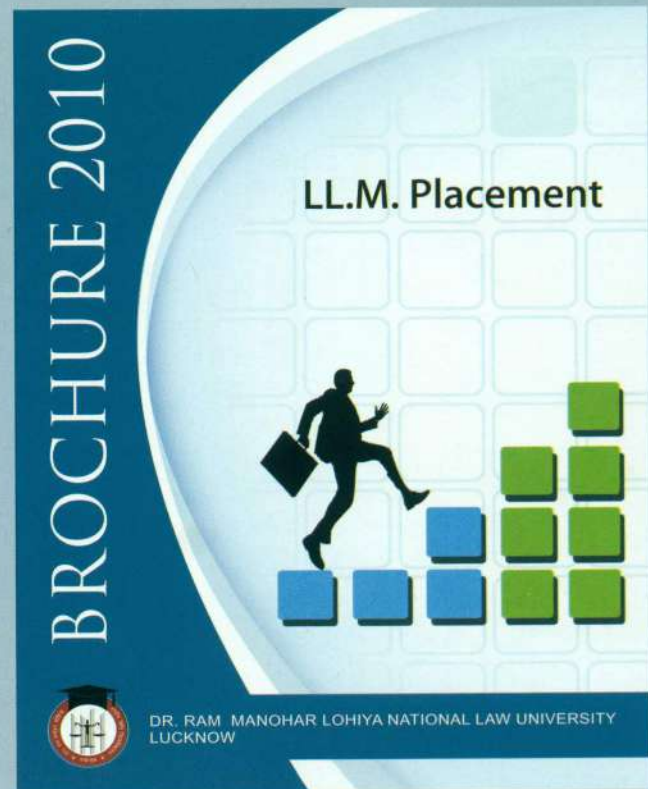
The Internship and Placement Committee is a Student Body working under the supervision and guidance of Mr. K.A. Pandey and Dr. Mridul Srivastava, Faculty Members and arranges for the Internship opportunities for the UG and PG students. In the year 2009-10, Dr. V. Visalakshi coordinated the placements of LL.M. Final Year Students.

It is very necessary that the theoretical discussions in the classrooms must be supplemented with practical exposure to legal environment. With this objective, the IPC ensures that during their summer and winter breaks, all the students are provided with the opportunities to work with different organizations and individuals in the field of law. The students have worked with reputed NGOs like PUCL, PUDR, CUTS, EHSAAS, Action Aid, Oxfam, CHRI, VATSALYA, NBA, etc and have also undergone training in different State Human Rights Commissions and interned with leading law firms and lawyers in the country.

During the month of Dec-Jan in 2009-10, around 20 UG and PG students of this University participated in a month long Winter Human Rights Training Programme at this University, sponsored by the NHRC, New Delhi. The IPC has also started an internship programme for its students so as to give them an opportunity to work with senior Government Advocates at Allahabad High Court. This is a unique internship programme of its kind in India where students have opportunity to intern with Advocate General and Additional Advocate General(s).

Internships and short term trainings are ongoing process under the stewardship of this Committee and it has started showing its impact on the overall academic development of the students. The Committee has also started the process of organizing Pre-placement Talks by prospective recruiters and employers.

Placements and internships are of utmost importance for the students, parents as well as the University because the national level ranking of the university and the future of the students depends upon the internships and final placements of the students in the top organizations. Keeping this aspect in view Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University created an Advisory Committee of partners of some leading Law firms of the country to suggest and advise on the placement and internship related issues. 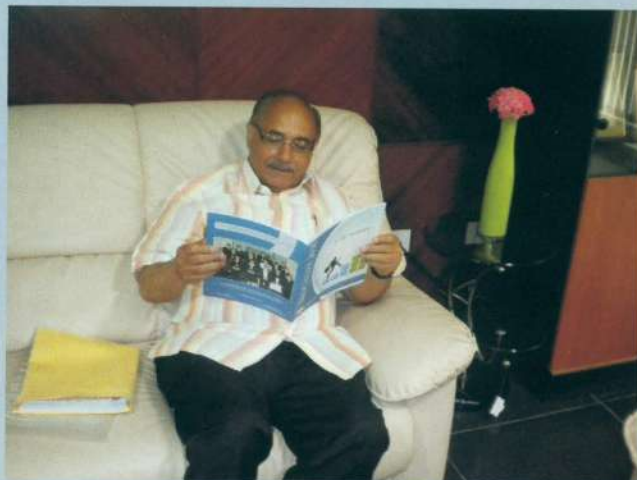

# WINTER HUMAN RIGHTS TRAINING PROGRAMME - 2009-10

India is still facing numerous serious problems including extra-judicial killings, disappearances, torture and rape by security forces as well as by terrorists etc. which need an immediate attention of the persons and authorities dealing with human rights problems. There are various issues which are around us and related to violation of human rights but many times we ignore them. As responsible and sensitive citizens of the country, we must act on such problems in our own capacity and also we should not become part of the human rights violator population.



Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University in collaboration with National Human Rights Commission organised a Winter Human Rights Training Programme 2009 from 26th December, 2009 to 25th January, 2010. More than 56 Resource Persons contributed and around 70-80 different aspects of Human Rights were covered. More than 62 participants from the State of Uttar Pradesh and Uttaranchal benefited from this training programme. Not only were lectures organised, but these participants also got an opportunity to do the field work with almost 15 leading NGOs of the Lucknow city. In order to

introduce the seriousness in the training programme the participants were asked to submit their project report on different aspects of Social Problems and Human Rights.

This programme was a good attempt to sensitize the youth of the country. The suggestions given by the resource persons and the participants for the improvement of the Human Rights situation of the country were very useful. It was for the first time in the history of any training programme that so many experts of National and International fame came together to think, discuss, analyze and act in the area of Human Rights Protection.

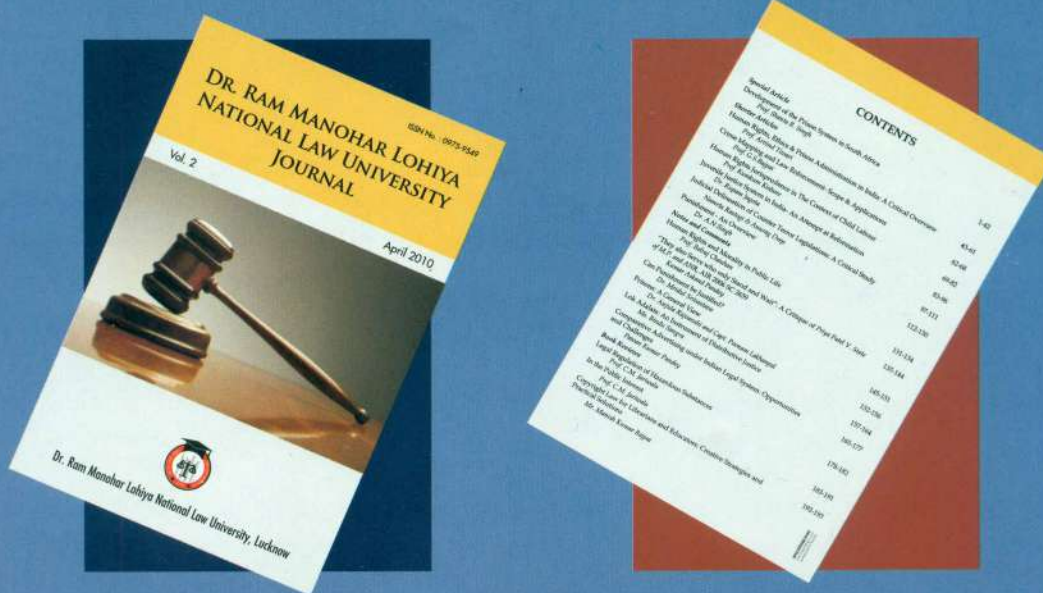

# TRAINING PROGRAMME ON "LATEST RULINGS WITH REGARD TO CRIMINAL LAW" FOR POLICE OFFICERS

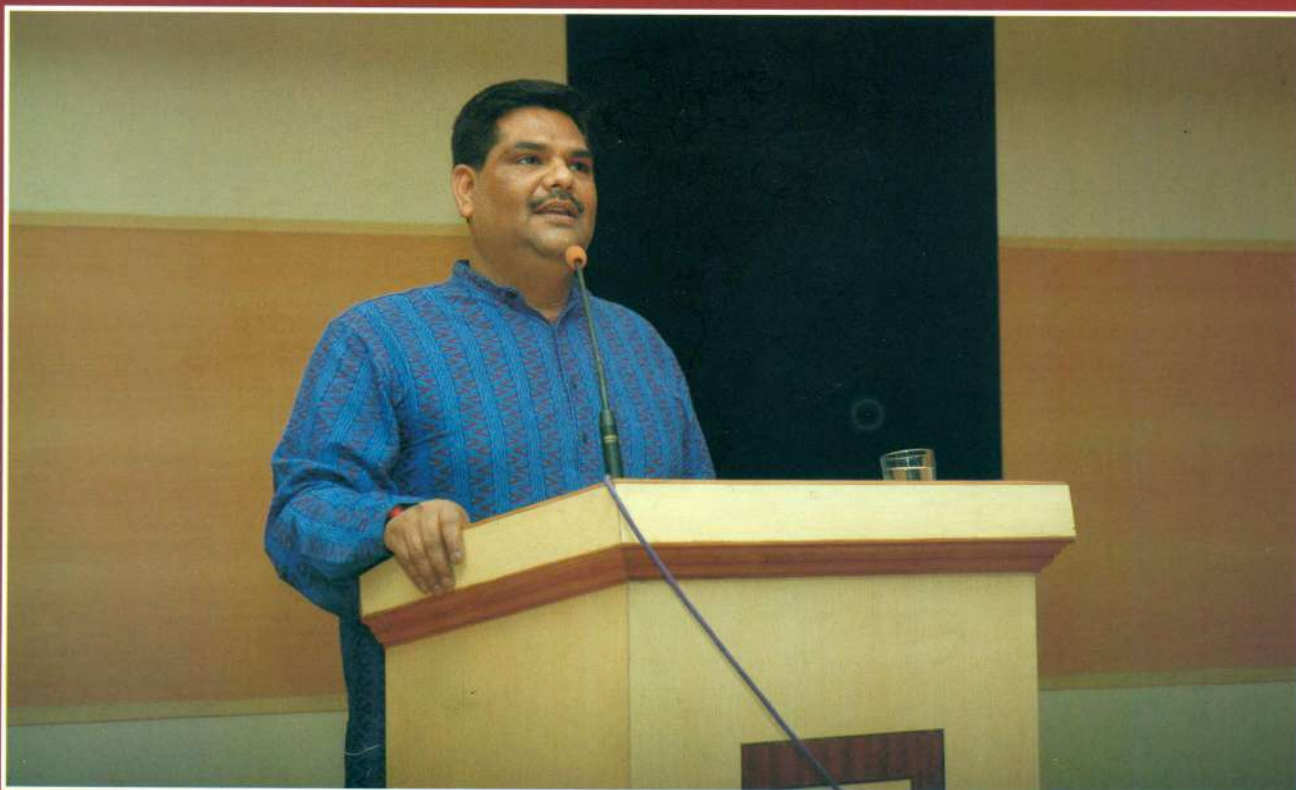

5. Discussion and summarization of issues.



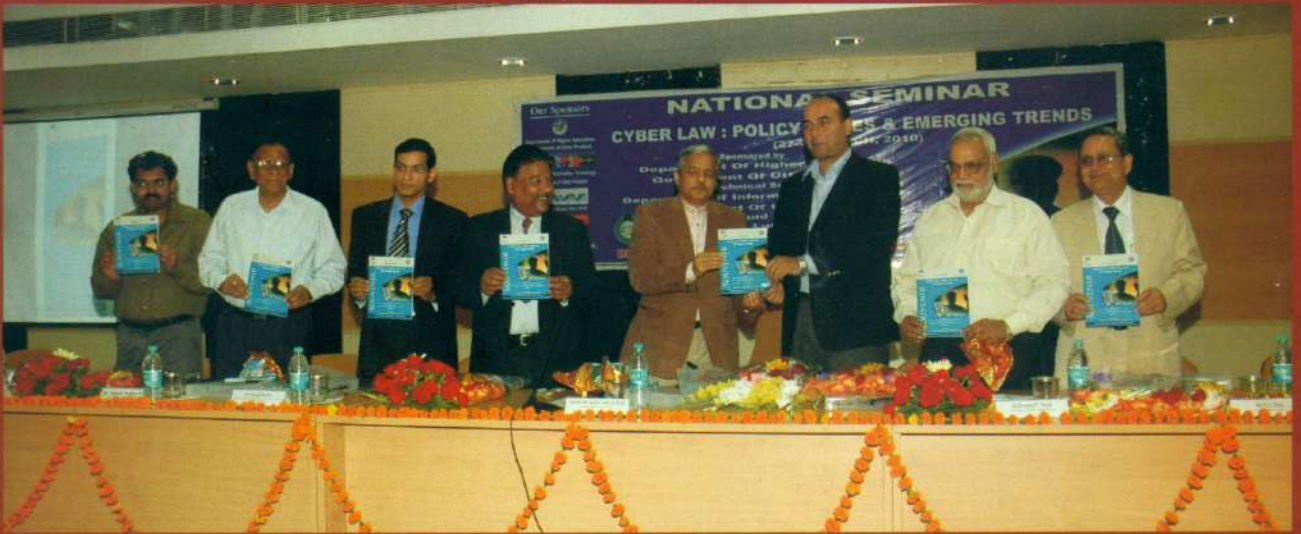

The welcome address given by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Balraj Chauhan emphasized that the seminar is aimed at evaluating the strength and the weakness of existing cyber laws so that useful recommendation may be made to the departments concerned for its effective implementation. The inauguration was also graced by Prof. C.M. Jariwala, President, Organizing Committee and Mr. K.A. Pandey, Organizing Secretary.

In his inaugural address, Hon'ble Justice Yatindra Singh enlightened the audience with a comprehensive insight into the complex legal issues embodied in the IT Act and IPR laws along with a comparative analysis of Indian and International situation regarding procedural obstacles in combating cyber crime. He suggested awareness, training and enforcement as the best strategy against cyber crime along with enhancing public education & vigilance through tentative questions on Cyber law in English and vernacular languages. Drawing an analogy from the paradox in 'A Tale of Two Cities' he said, “If we don't take precautions then the paradox of internet and cyberspace may lead to banking/financial trade on line catastrophe or compromise in the national security or our personal lives.”





The inaugural lecture was followed by three technical sessions on various themes such as E-commerce and E-governance, effect of the 2008 amendment in the Information Technology Act on Cyber Crime, regulating Freedom of Information and protection of human rights. Theme papers for the respective sessions were presented by Mr. Sanjeev Singh, Technical Head, International Council of E-commerce Consultants, Dubai, Prof. R. Thilagaraj, Head, Dept. of Criminology, University of Madras, Ms. Latha Subramaniam,

Secretary, ISC and Prof. Sarfaraz Ahmed & Prof. Kavita Singh, NUJS, Kolkata.

The first day of the seminar saw a participation of 200 students and faculty members from various esteemed universities across India such as BVU, Pune, University of Lucknow, B.R. Ambedkar University, Lucknow, Gorakhpur University and U.P.E.S, Dehradun along with Uttar Pradesh Police and the Department of Education, Government of Uttar Pradesh.



## LECTURE OF PROF. JORG MENZEL

Prof. Jorg Menzel, Legal Advisor to the Kingdom of Cambodia delivered a lecture on 13th April, 2010 on the topic " The German Constitutional Court" to the students of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow. It was interesting to know the functioning of the highest court of Germany. There are two senates in Constitutional Court and each senate comprises of 8 judges who may be professors, advocates etc. The tenure of each judge is 12 years without a possibility of reappointment. # MOOT COURT COMPETITIONS

## MOOTING AT RMLNLU.....

Attending a law school, student should take up at least two different extracurricular activities, one should satisfy student interests, another should promote students' future career. Law profession is the one where the absence of proficient skills and sufficient knowledge in the field may lead to a number of unpleasant consequences, from the loss of money to the ruin of reputation. Thus, to avoid any mistakes in future, students should attend moot courts to obtain additional



skills in the profession and one of the best training is that of a MOOT COURT.

Mooting is a very worthwhile educative tool. It gives a taste of what it is like to argue a case in a real court. It is essentially a practice court room to equip the students with advocacy skills on a disputed point of law. Moot Court competitions give a chance to test theoretical knowledge in real life situations. Through the process of mooting one learns how to construct the analytical arguments, to present the legal point logically and effectively, and to address the queries and concerns of the opponent and the moot master. For a law student there is no greater skill than constructing logical and compelling arguments.



The University, ever since its inception puts special focus on clinical legal education in form of Moot Court activities considering that it is a thrust area of legal education. Our mooting schedule represents the best accelerated learning programme to equip our students with research and advocacy skills with a view to prepare them for their professional life ahead. Realising the prime importance of this activity, the University, lays special emphasis and stress on mooting activities from the very first year. In the Academic Year

of 2009-10, the University got represented in more than 40 moot court competitions by its students at national and international level. This clearly depicts the extent of enthusiasm present in the hearts of the students for moots and to gain practical knowledge.

Students gave outstanding performances and even brought laurels by winning prizes and giving a remarkable performance which bought the University on the national map. RMLNLU team comprising of Bhadra Bharadwaj, Ritupriya Gurtoo and Jyotsna Nagvanshi won the 2nd CMR National Moot Court Competition, Bangalore and also fetched the best advocate award and cash prize of Rs 25000 and Rs 5000 respectively.



Similarly the University stood runners up in IV Annual National Moot Court Competition 2009-2010 held in Mumbai and even bagged best memorial award in Lokmanya Tilak Appellate Moot Competition 2009-2010. Even in international moots like Phillip C. Jessup the students gave an remarkable performance and were the semi finalist

### **MOOT COURT COMMITTEE**

Under the Chairmanship of Mr. A.P Singh, there is a fully functional Moot Court Committee which was set up in order to maximize the benefits that the students could draw from such competitions. The Committee looks into organizing and monitoring the moot court activities and is responsible for organizing intra-rounds for selection of teams for national and international mootings events.

The year 2010 has been very special because Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow for its first time got an opportunity to host the prestigious Phillip C. Jessup international Moot Court Competition (North Rounds jointly with Suarana and Surana. Named after the Philip Caryl Jessup, this competition is claimed to be the largest and most prestigious moot court competition in the world. As many as 14 teams from North India had participated in this competition, including teams from National Law University, Jodhpur, Rajeev Gandhi National University of Law, Patiala; Gujarat National Law University, Gandhinagar, Faculty of Law, Delhi University etc. Event commenced from 16th of January with an Inaugural Ceremony. The Chief Guest of the Ceremony was Mr. Anant Kumar Mishra, Cabinet Minister for Health, Government of Uttar Pradesh and the session was presided over by Hon'ble Mr Justice V. C. Mishra, Chairman, State Law Commission, Uttar Pradesh. The Valedictory Session commenced the next day, i. e. on 17th January. The Chief Guest of the ceremony was Hon'ble Mr. Justice S. N. Shukla, Judge, Allahabad High Court, Lucknow Bench and was presided by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Vishnu Sahay, Member, U. P State Human Rights Commission.

# Symposium on "Shifting Paradigms: Mapping Internationalization of Education in India" on 17th-18th April, 2010 at RMLNLU, Lucknow

Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University in collaboration with Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute organized a two day Symposium on "Shifting Paradigms: Mapping Internationalization of Education in India" on April 17th-18th, 2010. Founded in 1968 by the Government of India and the Government of Canada and named after the former Prime Minister, Sri Lal Bahadur Shastri, SICI is a unique bi-national educational enterprise whose mandate is to



promote academic and cultural linkages. The Institute today has a membership of 50 premier institutions in India – including IIMs and IITs, and 38 institutions in Canada.

The Ministry of Higher Education - India, in their effort to prepare the younger generation to seize the opportunities of Globalization, has been responding to these economic shifts by introducing a series of reforms in the knowledge sector such as the landmark Foreign Universities Bill. Participants of the Symposium include: senior administrative heads of the Institutions i.e. Vice-Chancellors, Deans, and senior academicians from IITs, IIMs, Law Institutions and Central and State Universities of India

Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice-Chancellor of RMLNLU welcomed the participants and highlighted the bi-national character of Shastri Institute and emphasized on its role in promoting understanding between Canada and India through academic activities and linkages. Prof. Chauhan further talked about

differences in globalization and internationalization of education and opined that now higher education is considered the ticket to future success because a university education translates into new skills and better prospects.



Prof. Sunaina Singh, Vice President / President elect, Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute (SICI), as the convener of the Conference while introducing the Symposium informed that the idea of Shifting Paradigms: Mapping Internationalization of Education in India was conceived when the discussion of Foreign

providers bill was happening in Ministry of Human Resource Development. Prof. Sunaina Singh opened the debate doors for this milestone bill on Internationalization of education in India. She also raised some important concerns as globalization should not merely mean opening the gates to foreign universities to set up shop but it should raise the bar for ourselves and reach the standards and stature of the best in the world. How well the government plans and funds our research programmes in universities and premier institutions is an important question to deal with. Furthering her speech Prof. Singh suggested some ways to deal with this whole issue of foreign providers and maintaining the quality and standards of higher education in India.



Prof. Sunaina Singh suggested that we must involve and exchange industries in educational research process; invite more entrepreneurs to invest in education; government to put more funding in to fundamental research and pull out the political interferences; adopt aggressive marketing strategy to market our intellectual capital and increase the level of our educational standards. It is important that our national policies should help to increase the knowledge flow wherein education and research form a synergy leading to the growth of economy and advancement of social structures. She concluded her talk by saying that the challenge is that we do not allow mediocrity or all the international Institutions to come in. We need to be selective and cautious in our optimism.

Prof. Sudhanshu Bhushan, Head, Higher & Professional Education, National University of Educational Planning and Administration (NUEPA), Delhi in his Keynote address on "Internationalization of Higher education: developing countries perspective", focused on globalization and dynamics of knowledge. He also raised issue of Internationalization and the current ongoing debate on Internationalization of education and issues from the perspectives of developed countries and dilemmas of developing countries.

Prof. Sheila Embleton, President, Shastri Indo -Canadian Institute, in her thanks note emphasized on prospects of foreign bill and its impact on Shastri Institute's vision for future. Prof. Embleton also talked about worldwide experience of opening of education market and its consequences.

In subsequent, session Prof. T. S. Naidu, Dean, Pondicherry University: presented a paper on "Globalization and its impact on Higher Education in India"

Prof. Sebastian Morris, Professor, Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad : in his presentation on "Scale and scope of Indian Elite Educational Institution" emphasized on the design of elite education institutions (IITs, IIMs etc.), and said even if they do have the debility of dysfunctional interference from the government and politicians, there is no scope and their small scale makes their costs very high. Additionally lavish and large campuses with sparse students, stand alone buildings, distant location makes their operative cost very high. Their lack of scope means that for many source disciplines like humanities and law, their faculty do not have a sufficient size to be sustained and achieve excellence. They need to scale up at the current locations, grow into other areas with synergy. Only then can their costs be moderate enough to be supported by the state.

## DISCUSSION ON "BHOPAL VERDICT"



Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow organized a discussion on "Bhopal Verdict" on 22nd June, 2010. Several renowned persons of the city took part in the discussion. The panelists included Mr. Justice (Rtd.) Kamleshwar Nath, Ms Vandana Misra of PUCL, Uttar Pradesh, Mr. Ishwar Chandra Dwevedi, IPS (Rtd.), Dr. Sandeep Pandey, Social Activist and Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice-Chancellor of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University. The convener of the discussion Dr. Sanjay Singh introduced the dignitaries to the house. The faculty members, students and human rights activists also took part in the discussion.

In his opening remark Prof. Balraj Chauhan said that timing is very important for a healthy discussion on this current topic. He pointed out that some of the principles of the criminal law have not been properly handled e.g. knowledge, negligence, recklessness, gross negligence etc. He raised the issue of CBI failure in gathering proper evidence. Before the leakage on the fateful night, a few employee had already died due to laxity on the part of UCC administration but at that time nobody bothered about the reasons behind their death. He also emphasized that justice should reach at the doors of the common people and there should be respect for law. Education without values is useless.

Dr. Sandeep Pandey said that this is the high time when we have to find out whether in future democracy will prevail in India or not. Corporate sector is holding upper hand on the governments and dictating their terms. This particular case is another example of this trend and that's why Anderson managed to flee from the country.

Justice Kamleshwar Nath said that this incident was not only a disaster but this is an indication of a different tragic story. He also said that this proves the spineless government was there at that time, people were helpless, Multinationals are very powerful and also indicated the media failure.



Mr. Ishwer Chandra Dwevedi, Retd IPS said that the companies are not caring about the security measures which are necessary for preventing any mishappening in the name of cost cutting. For an industry profit becomes supreme and government machinery is not able to check properly. Ms. Vandana Mishra of PUCL, U.P. said that victims cannot be compensated merely through money only. Those who lost their lives, those who become handicapped and those who are still suffering because of the contemplated water or other environmental problem occurred because of the leakage. Ms. Mamta who is a victim of Bhopal gas tragedy also shared her views with the house.


