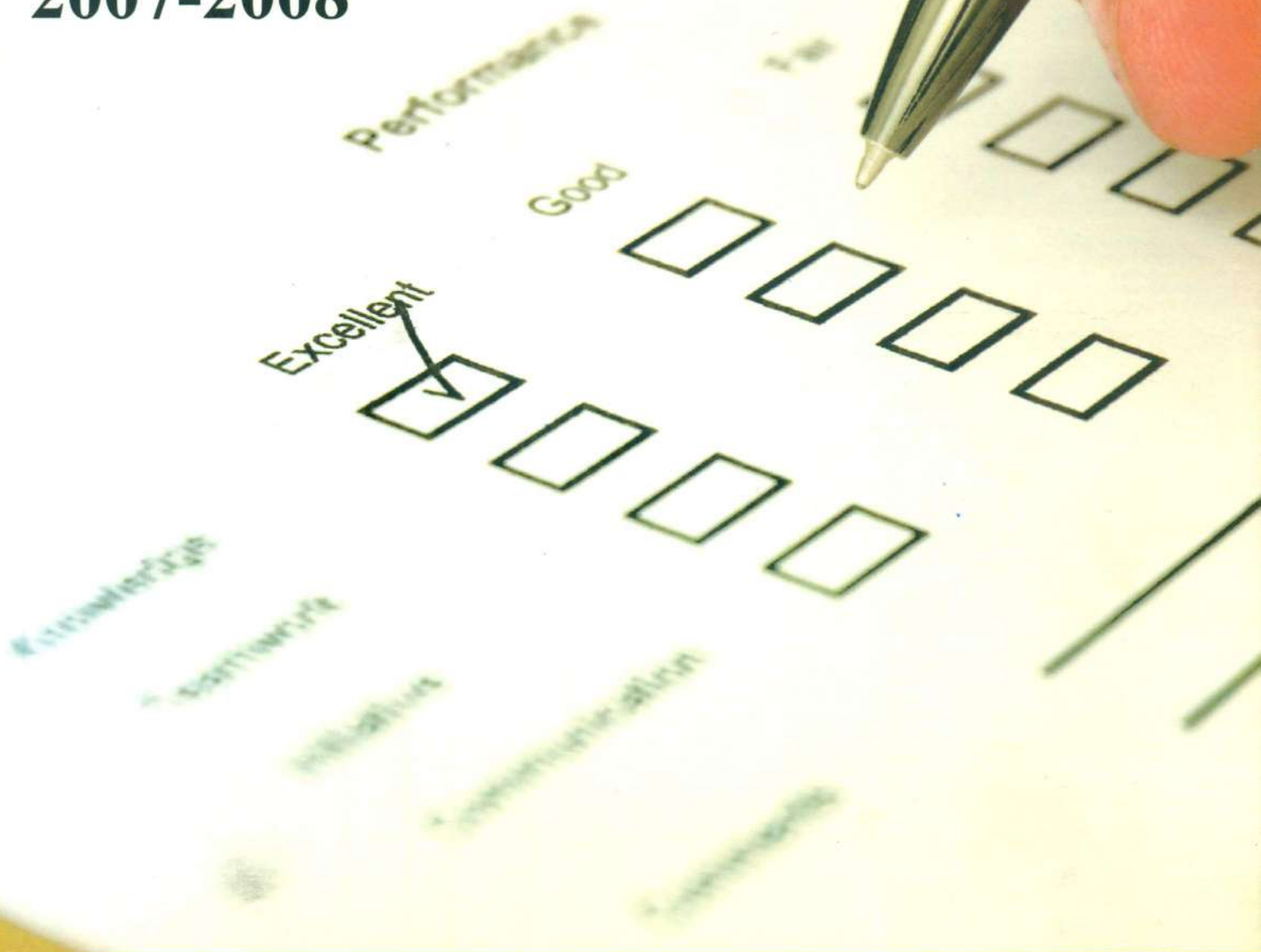


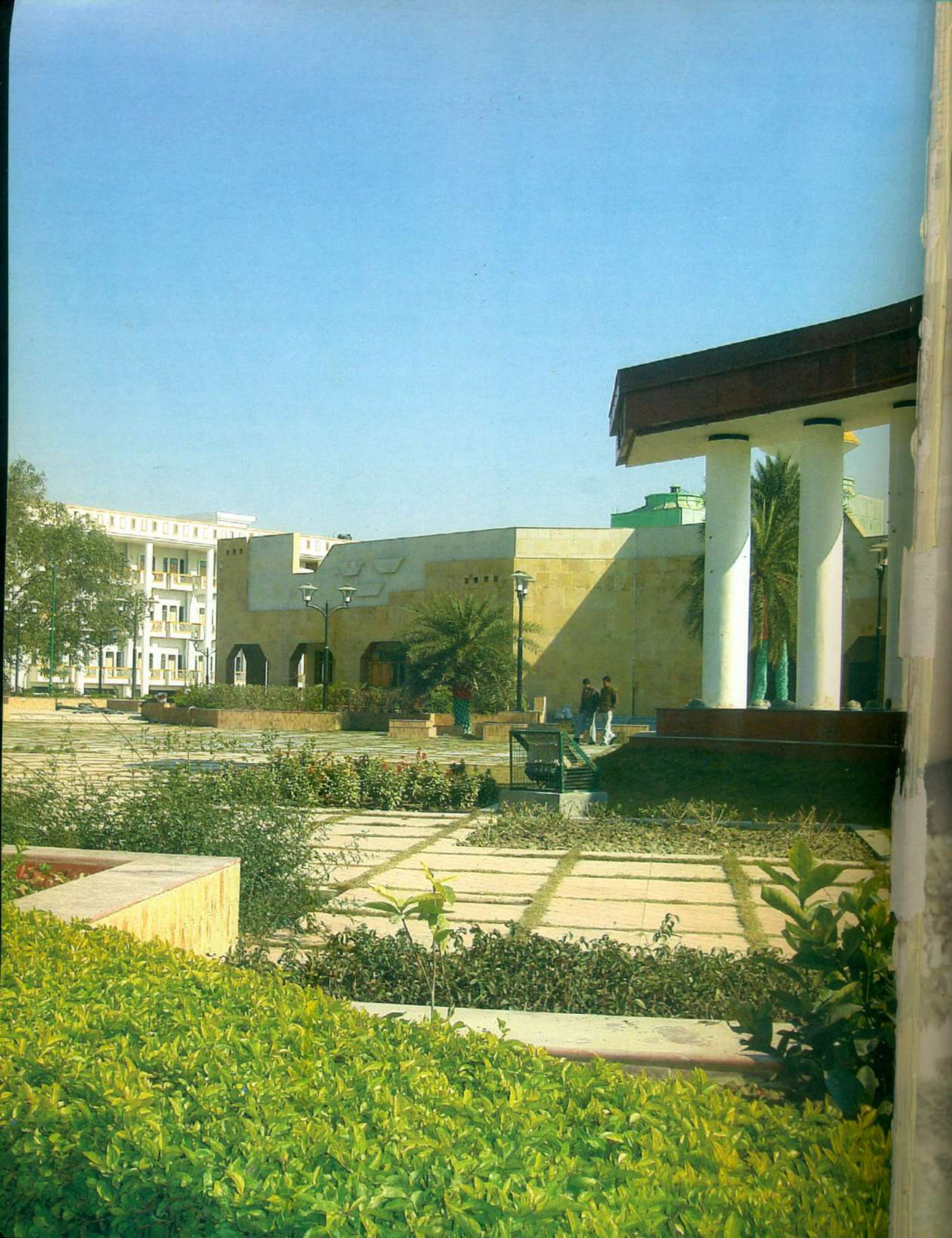

About The University

The year 1987 saw the beginnings of the tectonic shift in perceptions about law as a career from one of the least attractive careers, to one of the most sought after, with the establishment of the National Law School, Bangalore. It was a time of hope for the legal fraternity. The concept of a national institution to act as a pace-setter and a testing ground for bold experiments in legal education came up before the Bar Council of India in the context of the Council's statutory responsibility for maintaining standards in professional legal education (under the Advocates Act).

DR. RAM MANOHAR LOHIYA NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY was established by an Act of Govt. of Uttar Pradesh in 2005, U.P. Act No 28 of 2005 and came into being on 4th of January 2006 to meet the new challenges in legal fields and to strengthen the vision that was given by the establishment of first National Law School of the country. Originally incorporated as **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Institute, Uttar Pradesh** word 'Institute' was substituted by 'University' later, vide an amendment in the Act in November, 2006. This was done to give a comprehensive national character to the Institute on lines with the other premier National Law Universities of the country.

The University, which is getting liberal grants from the State Government, is committed to provide excellent infrastructural facilities and environment to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of Law and legal process and to develop in the students and research scholars a sense of responsibility to serve society in the field of Law by developing skills in advocacy, judicial and other legal services and legislation and the like. The present law has to meet the requirements of the society in the 21st Century. Law has to deal with problems of diverse magnitudes and a student of Law and an Advocate has to be trained in professional skills to meet the challenges of globalization and universalisation of Law. With the advent of multinationals in India, as anywhere else, the task of lawyers would be highly technical and an imperative need would arise to have competent lawyers who would be trained in the right culture of Legal Education. This makes a sound case for introducing reforms in Legal Education; and we, at the Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University aim at all these aspects.

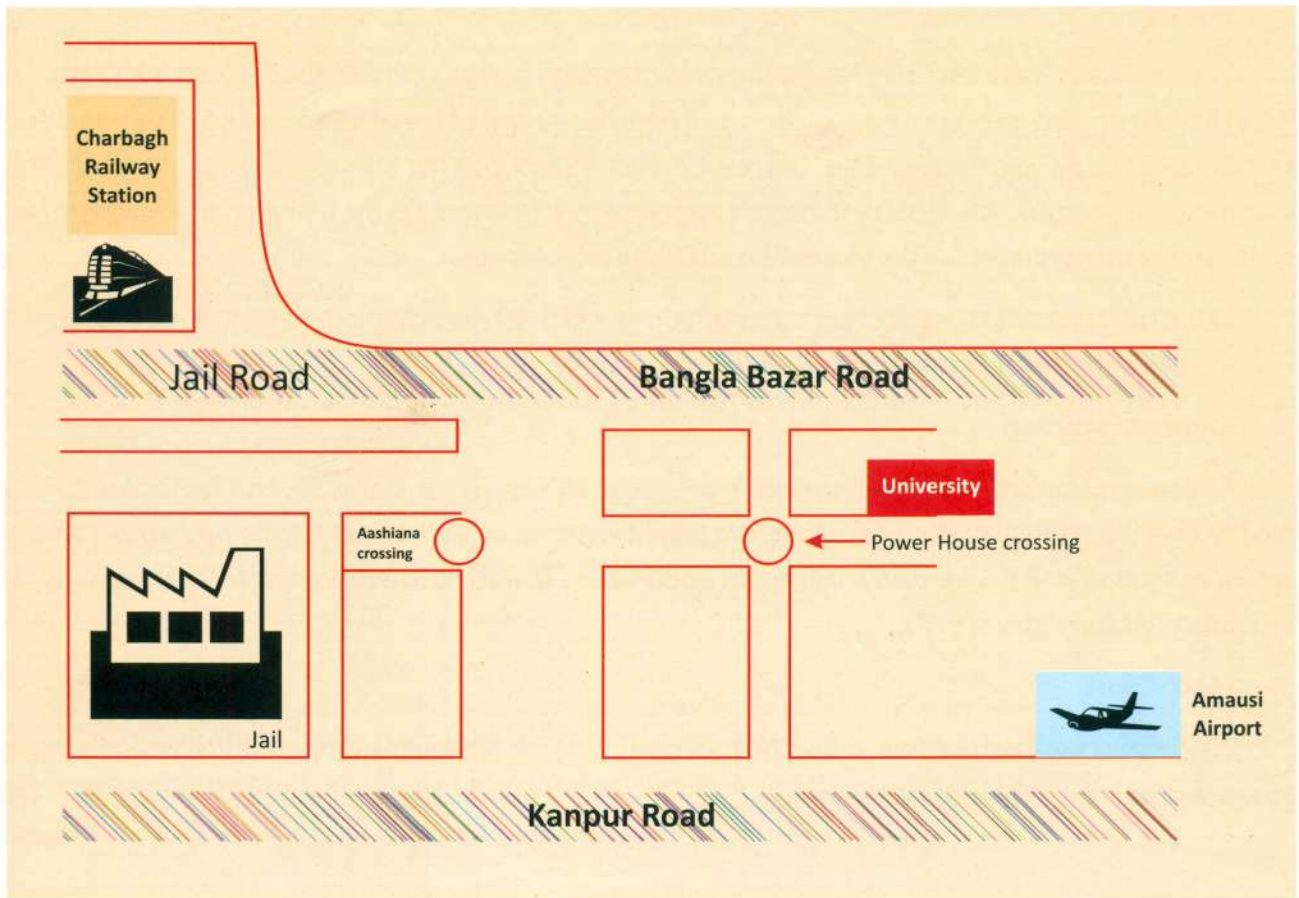

Location

The strategic location of the university is also an important feature of the university. The university is at equal distance from the main Railway Station, Charbagh and from the Airport also. The distance is less than 5 kilometres from both the places. The university is situated in the state capital i.e. Lucknow and all the important state offices are within its reach.





Infrastructural Support

The university has the best infrastructure and all the three important pillars - Academic Block, Administrative Block and Library - are centrally air conditioned. There are certain plans to invite foreign participants and experts in future. Therefore, this support system will act as a positive factor in fulfilling the dreams of future.

1. Library

The university has a very rich library in terms of quality and quantity of good books. The library is full of good texts and reference books, almost all encyclopaedias of social sciences and all national and international legal databases. The university also subscribes to more than 75 national and international journals. The Library is also equipped with 60 computers for research purpose and has comfortable sitting places for the students, faculty and researchers.

In the Library itself, there are two training halls in which 40 participants can be trained in one hall. The university has video conferencing facilities also.

2. Internet Facilities

At present the university system has more than 100 computers and several laptops with the faculty and the students. The computers are linked with the internet LAN facility and above all the whole campus is wi-fi enabled which gives an opportunity to each and every person on the campus to be connected with internet 24X7.

3. Moot Court

The moot court hall of the university can be said to be the best looking and technically most advanced moot court hall in the country.





4. Seminar Hall & Auditorium

The University has a seminar hall with a sitting capacity of 300. The University organizes most of the functions in the seminar hall. It has all the audio-video and presentation facilities. The upcoming auditorium with a capacity of 3500 persons will be the largest auditorium of the city.

5. Guest House

The university has a fully furnished guest house offering the best facilities to the guests. At one point of time it can accommodate more than 60 persons. It has some VIP suites also.

6. Sports & Health Activities

Sports activities and health care is also an important aspect of the University. The University has all the necessary things for physical activities like sports complex, health centre and stadium. The campus also has the facility of a swimming pool.

7. Commercial Complex

The university is planned in such a manner that all items of daily use are available to all the persons in the campus itself. It has a small shopping complex in which shops for stationery, general items and food corner are available.

8. Hostel

The University has two hostels, one for the boys and one for the girls. The overall capacity of all the hostel rooms is around 1000 students.

9. Security

The University has adequate infrastructure for the safety and security of the Students, Faculty and Administrative Staff. Adequate arrangements are in place for the safety of the persons living in the campus.

Moot Court

Purpose

Mooting is a very worthwhile educative tool. It gives a taste of what it is like to argue cases in court. It is essentially a practice court room to hone the advocacy skills on a disputed point of law. Moot Court competitions give a chance to test theoretical knowledge in real life situations. Through the process of mooting one learns how to construct analytical arguments, to present the legal point logically and in a sound manner and to address the queries and concerns of the opponent and the moot master.

For a Law Student there is no greater skill than constructing logical and compelling arguments.

Mooting at RMLNLU

The University, ever since its inception puts special focus on clinical legal education in form of Moot Court activities considering that it is a thrust area of legal education. Our mooting schedule represents the best accelerated learning program to equip our students with research and advocacy skills with a view to prepare them for their professional life ahead. Realising the prime importance of this activity, the University lays special emphasis and stress on mooting activities from the very first year. In the academic year of 2007-08, the University got represented in more than twenty moot court competitions by its students at national and international level. This clearly depicts the extent of enthusiasm present in the hearts of the students.

3. Moot Court Committee

Under the Chairmanship of Mr. A.P Singh, there is a fully functional Moot Court Committee which was set up in order to maximize the benefits that the students could draw from such competitions. The Committee looks into organizing and monitoring the moot court activities and is responsible for organizing intra-rounds for selection of teams for national and international mooting events.





Facilities for Moot Court Activities at RMLNLU

1. Library

The standard and quality of any educational institution mainly depends upon the facilities and services provided in the Library. In this regard our library is fully equipped to serve the purpose of providing almost all the resource material for proper and enhanced research work. The Library is an integral part of academic endeavor in the Law University. The library has all the important books written by renowned foreign and Indian authors on various essential issues like Environmental Law, International Humanitarian Law, Commercial Arbitration, Intellectual Property Rights, Criminal Law, Law of Contracts, Space Law and others. There are also various international and national journals along with essential database, which provides all the necessary requirements for a proper research work. Even for the beginners the library provides for basic books and Moot Guides highlighting the basic requirements needed, legal advocacy skills and also how to go about the research work.

2. Moot Court Hall

To get an experience and touch of a real court room the University provides for a fully functional attractive moot court hall equipped with the state-of-the-art court room necessities. It provides a *feeling of arguing in a real court room whereby enhancing the legal skills and advocacy skills of the students.*





Achievements of the students at National and International level

Though being a new entrant, the University has already made a place for itself in the moot scene by bringing laurels in various competitions. In the year 2007, the University team comprising of Sneha Thakur, Kameshwar Nath Tripathi and Ravi Kant Tripathi bagged “Best Researcher” medal in the VII Henry Dunant Moot Court Competition organized by Indian Society of International Law in India. Since then various teams from the University have made impressive performance by participating in various moot court competitions spread throughout India, making their mark on the competitive legal advocacy field.

Another remarkable achievement was winning the “Best Oralist” and “Best Memorial” award by the first semester students (Shazia Siddiqui, Tahreem Khan and Pallavi Bhusan) in Amity Freshers Moot Court Competition organized in Amity University, Lucknow in 2008.

Some Highlights of The Programmes of Previous Year

1. First U.P. Bar Council National Moot Court Competition at RMLNLU

The University organised its first moot court competition in cooperation with the Bar Council of U.P. This National Moot Court Competition was on Intellectual Property Rights related to Patent Law. The event was held on 28th-30th March 08. The Moot Event was a grand success with 25 teams participating from all round India. The event was a rejuvenating one, especially for the students of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University who had their first experience in organising a moot court competition. The efforts put in by the students of the host university as well as the participating teams was appreciated and acknowledged by one and all. The competition was a successful one which added a feather to the cap of the university.

The competition commenced with the inaugural ceremony on 28th March, '08 which was presided by Mr. S. Gopakumaran Nair, Chairman of Bar Council of India while the Chief Guest was Hon'ble Mr Justice H.L Gokhale, Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court and the Guest of Honour was Hon'ble Mr. Justice D.P Singh, Judge Lucknow Bench of Allahabad High Court and former chairman, Bar Council U.P. Twenty Five teams from all over the country participated in the competition. The jury of the competition included an academician, a lawyer and a judge while the final rounds of the prestigious moot court competition were judged by luminaries like Hon'ble Mr. Justice Markandey Katju, Judge of the Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Pradeep Kant, Senior Judge of Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court, Mr. Chandrashekharan and Mr. Ajay Sahni. Government Law College, Mumbai and HNLU, Raipur made to the final which was won by Government Law College, Mumbai. The winners of the competition were awarded a prize of Rs. 20,000 which was sponsored by Lexis-Nexis while trophy for the best student advocate went to Priyam Aggarwal of University School of Petroleum and Energy Studies, Dehradun with a prize of Rs.5000 and the Best Memorial award was won by I.L.S., Pune who again won Rs. 5000.





The event concluded with an impressive valedictory ceremony held on 30th March in the presence of Hon'ble Mr Justice Markandey Katju, Judge of Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Pradeep Kant, Senior Judge of Lucknow bench of Allahabad High Court, Hon'ble Mr. S.C. Misra and many more. The event was a unique experience especially for the students of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University who had their first experience in organising a moot court competition. The efforts put in by the students of the host university as well as the participating teams were appreciated and acknowledged by one and all.

VISION AHEAD

Under the able mentorship of moot court committee and guidance of faculty, the university looks forward to participate in competitions across the globe and making its debut in highly reputed competitions to the likes of **Willem C Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot and Stetson Environmental Moots** this year. Also, the university plans to conduct training sessions to enhance the skills of its young mooters and developing the 'mooting culture' among students.

2. REFLEXIONS 2008

Reflexions is the name of extra co-curricular activity to promote the photography skills of the students of RMLNLU. Keeping this objective in mind the Magazine and Journal Committee had organized a photography competition REFLEXIONS 2008 on the occasion of the 59th Republic Day. On the basis of the entries received the best twelve pictures were selected which have already been published in the first University calendar, REFLEXION 2008. The picture of Anvit Jain (IVth Sem) was ranked highest followed by Prashant's (IVth Sem) at 2nd and 3rd position.

3. All India Training Programme for Prison Officers on Personality Development

With the increasing awareness about human rights, the prisons are, of late, getting the attention they deserve. There has been a change in the perception of the society towards prisoners but the commensurate changes in the personality of the prison officials are not visible. Most of the training programmes generally organized for the prison officers had focused on the human rights issues or on other aspects of prison management. No serious efforts for the skill development of the officers have been taken so far. The officers, who are managing the jails are under constant pressure and are living a stressful life. This stress takes toll upon their performance level.

Prison officials have to work in the system which needs a change. The challenge for the prison officials is to make a balance between the personal and professional life. These prison officers have to deal with very difficult and hard core criminals and most of the time they are busy in managing day-to-day routine for smooth running of the prison. They are more concerned about the security of the prison. Looking into these aspects Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University organised an “All India Training Programme on Personality Development for Prison Officials” sponsored by the Bureau of Police Research and Development, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, New Delhi. It was





the first occasion for the Prison Officials when a training programme was organised for their own personality development. The purpose of holding this training programme was to identify the lacunae present in the policies and programme of the prisons and to find the affordable solutions. As the aim was to pave the way for these officials to develop their personality in such a way so as to resolve their stress and manage the resources available to them in a better way. In this three-day training programme more than 44 participants from all over India participated. The representation was from the State of Haryana, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, Karnataka and West Bengal.

The training programme conducted was a success as it was evident from the feedback of the participants. The training programme offered a platform for prison officials to develop mutual relationship with the prison officials of other states and follow success of each other.

After the successful completion of the training programme, the University published the report of the programme.

4. Summer Human Rights Training Programme-2008

India is still facing numerous serious problems including extra-judicial killings, disappearances, torture and rape by security forces as well as by terrorists etc. which need an immediate attention of the persons and authorities dealing with human rights problems. There are various issues which are around us and related to violation of human rights but many times we ignore them. As responsible and sensitive citizens of the country, we must act on such problems in our own capacity and also we should not become part of the human rights violator population.

Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University in collaboration with National Human Rights Commission organised a Summer Human Rights Training Programm 2008 from 16th June to 15th July, 2008. More than 56 Resource Persons contributed and around 70-80 different aspects of Human Rights were covered. More than 62 participants from the State of Uttar Pradesh and Uttaranchal benefited from this training programme. Not only were lectures organised, but these participants also got an opportunity to do the field work with almost 15 leading NGOs of the Lucknow city. In order to introduce the seriousness in the training programme the participants were asked to submit their project report on different aspects of Social Problems and Human Rights.





This programme was a good attempt to sensitize the youth of the country. The suggestions given by the resource persons and the participants for the improvement of the Human Rights situation of the country were very useful.

It was for the first time in the history of any training programme that so many experts of National and International fame came together to think, discuss, analyze and act in the area of Human Rights Protection. 5. Grand Intra-Moot

Intra-University Moot Court Competition, 2008-09 (Grand-Qualification Round).

Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow successfully organized its first Intra-University Moot Court Competition, 2008-09 (Grand-Qualification Round). The event was from 13th to 14th of September, 2008. The aim of this event was to extract the best deserving teams who would be representing the University in various National and International Moot Court Competitions.





Procedure

- ▶ A proposition based on the Law of Contract was released 15 days earlier to the event. The teams had to prepare a memorandum from both the sides of the proposition.
- ▶ 24 teams were registered out of which 20 teams actually turned up for the competition.
- ▶ The memorandums were submitted on 9th September and were sent for evaluation on 10th to Mr. Anant Tewari, Advocate, High Court of Allahabad (Lucknow Bench) and to Prof. Umesh Kumar.
- ▶ The first draw of lots took place in the evening of 12th September on the basis of which teams were given the name of their opponent team and subsequently the exchange of memorials took place.
- ▶ Next day (13th September, 2008 ROUND 1), the competition took place in 5 moot courts in which 10 teams argued from the side of appellant and the rest 10 from the side of the respondent in front of a bench comprising two judges.
- ▶ Again, there was a draw of lots in the evening in which the teams changed their sides and their opponents for the next day competition (ROUND 2) as to provide them sufficient chance to show their research and advocacy skills.

Based on the cumulative scores of both the rounds and the marks of the memorials, the teams were given the ranking.
