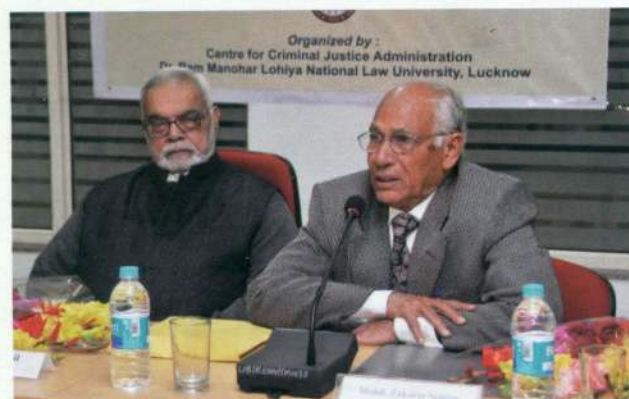

About The University

The year 1987 saw the beginning of the tectonic shift in perceptions about law as a career from one of the least attractive careers, to one of the most sought after, with the establishment of the National Law School, Bangalore. It was a time of hope for the legal fraternity. The concept of a national institution to act as a pace-setter and a testing ground for bold experiments in legal education came up before the Bar Council of India in the context of the Council's statutory responsibility for maintaining standards in professional legal education (under the Advocates Act).

DR. RAM MANOHAR LOHIYA NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY was established by an Act of Govt. of Uttar Pradesh in 2005, U.P. Act No. 28 of 2005 and came into being on 4th January, 2006 to meet up the new challenges in legal fields and to strengthen the vision that was given by the establishment of the first National Law School of the State of U.P. Originally incorporated as **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Institute, Uttar Pradesh**, the word 'Institute' was substituted by the 'University' later, vide an amendment in the Act in November, 2006. This was done to give a comprehensive national character to the institution on lines with the other premier National Law Universities of the country.

The University is committed to provide excellent infrastructural facilities and environment to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of law and legal process and to develop in the students and research scholars a sense of responsibility to serve the society in the field of law by developing skills in advocacy, judicial and other legal services and legislation and the like. The present law has to meet the requirements of the society and the challenges of the 21st Century. Law has to deal with problems of diverse magnitudes and a student of law and an Advocate has to be trained in Professional skills to meet the challenges of globalization and universalisation of law. With the advent of multinationals in India, as anywhere else, the task of lawyers would be highly technical and an imperative need would arise to have competent lawyers who would be trained in the right culture of Legal Education. This makes a sound case for introducing reforms in Legal Education; and we, at the Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University aim at all these aspects.

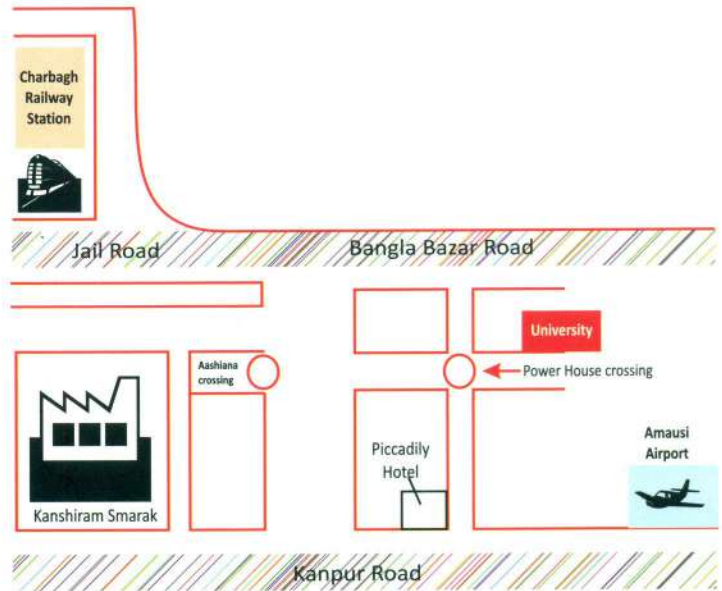

LAYOUT PLAN



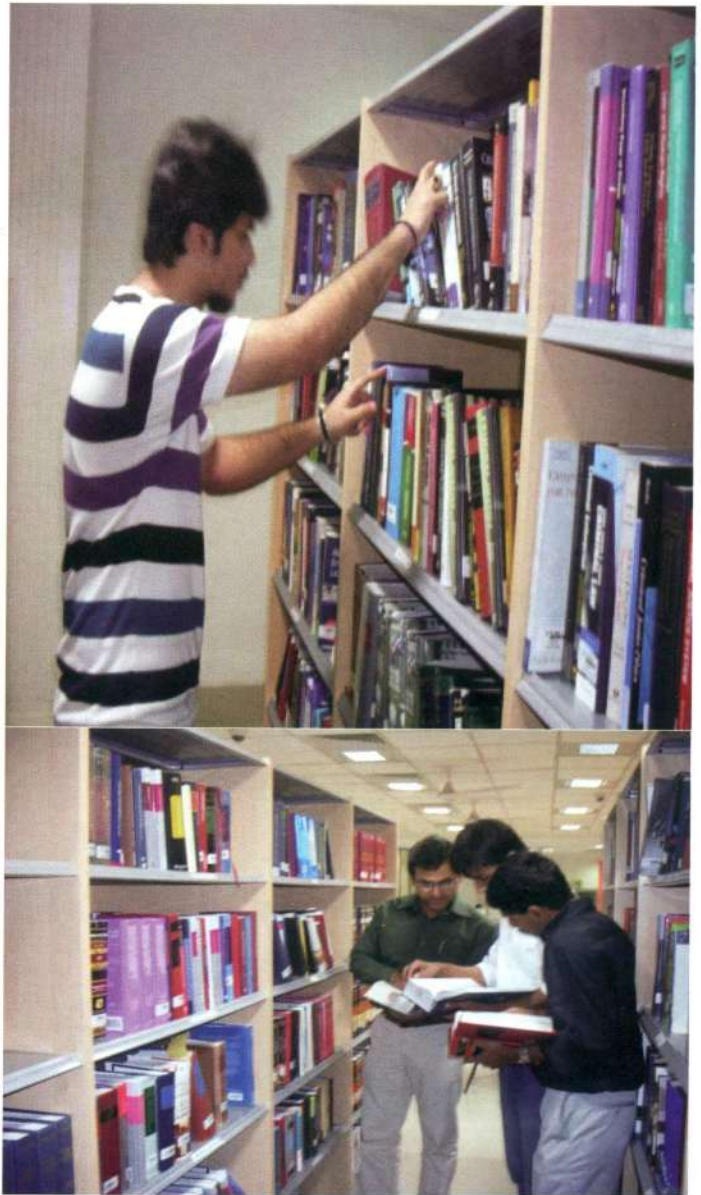

1. DR. MADHU LIMAYE LIBRARY

The university has a very rich library in terms of quality and quantity of good books, journals, CD-ROMs and Online Databases. The library is full of good texts and reference books, almost all encyclopedias of social sciences and all national and international legal databases. The university also subscribes to more than 75 national and international journals. The library is also equipped with 60 computers for the research purposes and has comfortable sitting places for the students, faculty and researchers. Library housekeeping services are automated through LIBSYS Library automation software.

In the library itself, there are two training halls in which 40 participants can be trained in each hall. The university has video conferencing facilities as well. Library provides Online Public Access Catalogue (Web-OPAC), article indexing services. The Web-OPAC can be accessed through <http://172.16.0.3:8080/opac> within LAN service of the University. Library remains closed only on the three national holidays. From this year a new service of Books content sources has been introduced in the library which can be accessed through WEB-OPAC.

2. INTERNET FACILITIES

At present university system has more than 250 computers and provided laptops to all the faculty members. The computers are linked with LAN. Above all the whole campus is wi-fi enabled which gives an opportunity to each and every person on the campus to be connected with 2GB internet connectivity 24 x 7.

3. MOOT COURT HALL

The moot court hall of the University can be said to be the best looking and technically most advanced moot court hall in the country.

4. SEMINAR HALL & AUDITORIUM

The University has a seminar hall with a sitting capacity of 300. The University organizes most of the functions in the seminar hall. It has all the audio-video and presentation facilities. The auditorium with a capacity of 3500 persons is the largest auditorium of the city.

5. GUEST HOUSE

The University has a fully furnished guest house offering the best facilities to the guests. At one point of time it can accommodate more than 60 persons. It has some VVIP and VIP suites also.

6. SPORTS & HEALTH CARE ACTIVITIES

Sports activities and health care are also important aspects of the University. The University has all the necessary facilities for physical activities like sports complex, health centre and stadium. The campus also has a swimming pool.

7. COMMERCIAL COMPLEX

The University is planned in such a manner that the things of daily use could be available to all the persons in the campus itself. It has a small shopping complex in which shops for stationery, general items and cafeteria are available.

8. HOSTEL

The University has three hostels, two for the boys and one for the girls. The overall capacity of all the hostel rooms is around 1500 students.

9. SECURITY

The University has adequate infrastructure for the safety and security of the students, Faculty and Administrative Staff. Adequate arrangements have been provided for the safety of the persons living in the campus.

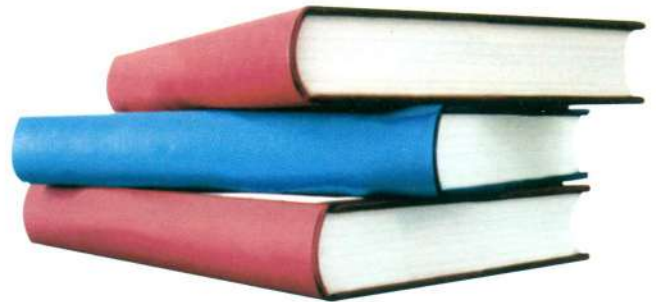

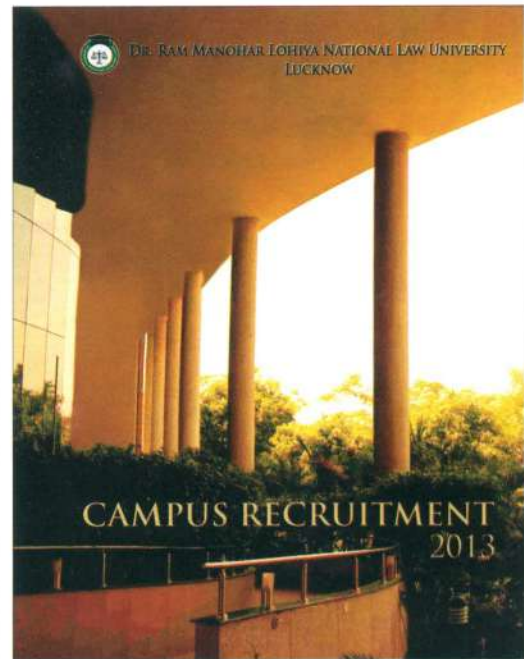

Moot Court Committee Report

The Moot Court Committee (MCC) is the student committee entrusted with the responsibility of administering and organising mooting activities. Mooting as an activity can perhaps best be described as the closest one comes to being a lawyer while still in law school. The MCC's role is to facilitate and regulate mooting at RMLNLU. This involves planning, organising and executing the various moot court competitions.

MCC's first major mandate is to select teams to represent the University at various national and international moots. For this the MCC organises the University Moot Court Selections (UMCS) also known as Grand Intra. This year the Grand Intra had two pools- one for selecting teams for national moots and the other for selecting teams for international moots. The Grand Intra was organised on 3-4 September 2011. The team comprising of Roma Angelina Das, Vipul Kumar and Aakriti Pandey won the National pool while the team comprising of Siddhartha Singh, Mohit Pasham Reddy and Abhishek Singh won the International pool. The MCC also organised intra competitions for various prestigious moots such as Stetson, Manfred Lachs etc.



The MCC is also entrusted with the responsibility of developing future mooters, as well as an interest in mooting. In pursuance of this, the MCC follows a policy of encouraging participation in mooting from all batches, including the first years. 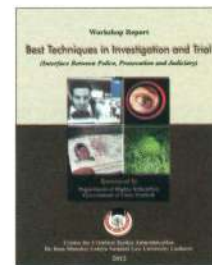


Celebration of Republic Day

This was an effort to create awareness in order to reduce pendency of cases through inexpensive and speedy out of court settlement method. This event was graced by International and National legal luminaries like Prof. Martin Price, Fullbright Scholar and mediation expert, USA, Mr. Niranjan Bhatt, senior advocate Ahmedabad High Court and pioneer in mediation, Mrs Sadhna Ramchandran, J.B. Singh, senior advocates of Supreme Court etc.



22 teams from various parts of the country like Delhi, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Gujarat, Kerala and Uttar Pradesh participated in this event.

Inaugural Ceremony of the 1st Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia National Law University Mediation Competition, Lucknow took place on 13th January, 2012. The ceremony was accompanied by distinguished international and national legal luminaries like Professor Martin Price, Fulbright scholar, Mrs. Sadhna Ramchandran, Mr. J.P. Singh Senior Advocates of the Supreme Court and Mr. I.B. Singh,

Organizing Secretary, Mediation Centre, Allahabad High Court, Ms. Anita Sahni, Ms. Ruhi Paul, Mr. Rajeev Aggarwal and other esteemed legal luminaries.



Vice chancellor, Prof. Balraj Chauhan welcomed the judges and participants who are taking part in this competition. While addressing, Prof. Balraj Chauhan applauded the efforts of the members of the Legal Aid Committee and the student

fraternity for organizing such a historical event and showed gratitude towards the dignitaries.

Commemorating the event, Prof. Martin Price, Fulbright scholar, USA, the chief guest, said, "The 1st RMLNLU National Mediation Competition marks not only a new national awareness of value of mediation of legal system and law practice but also the students would return with proficient mediatory skills and will become the

seedlings for making practice of law more holistic in approach", appreciating the effort of the university to organize the first of a kind mediation event in India.

The event witnessed the competitive attitude and tested mediation skills of students from various law schools like Campus Law Centre, Delhi University, National Law Schools of Bhopal, Kolkata, Jodhpur, Delhi, Orissa, Gandhinagar, Kochi, and Raipur, Christ Law College, Bangalore, Amity University, Noida and Lucknow, Allahabad University and other institutions. The final rounds took place on the 15th January, 2012. The Winners got a cash Prize of Rs. 25,000/-, Ist Runner Up Rs. 15,000 and IInd Runner up Rs. 10,000/- respectively. This competition imparted the skill to the students for out of court settlement of many disputes which in turn can reduce the pendency of the cases in the courts and reduce the time and money involved in it as well. This technique, though not new in nature but is extremely beneficial for the justice dispensation system.



The final day of the event culled out the best mediatory talent out of the 22 teams that participated from all over India in the 1st RMLNLU National Mediation Competition, **Richa Tyagi and Anushree Bardhan**, Campus Law Centre, Delhi and **Atul Madhavan and Kartik** from Sastra University, Chennai, qualified for the finals and **Richa Tyagi and Anushree Bardhan** from Campus Law Centre, Delhi University



won the 1st RMLNLU National Mediation Competition.

Richa Tyagi also won the best mediator award and along with her team-mate Anushree Bardhan took away the trophy and prize money worth more than Rs.25,000 along with a promising prospective career in mediation.

The judges for the semi-finals and finals were Hon'ble Justice

D.P. Singh, Allahabad High Court, Lucknow Bench, Mr. Martin Price, Mr. J.P. Singh, Ms. Sadhna Ramchandran, Ms. Veena Ralli, Ms. Amita Sahni, Mr. Niranjn Bhatt, senior advocates Delhi High Court and Mr. I.B.Singh.



On the occasion of this grand event, Justice D.P.Singh remarked that, “Student's responses with such remarkable mediatory skills at such a stage were both surprising and commendable.”

Mr. J.P. Singh added that “we have had such events out Asia but this event would leave a mark in history, it is an event for the first time not only in India but whole of Asia.”

He admired the effort of the University in culminating the idea into reality of such Mediation event that has in past only been held in United Kingdom and USA so far and creating a mass awareness of such method of Alternative Dispute Resolution.

“It is a creative platform to hone skills on the spot better than mootings, not only does it help on the profession front but contributes to solve mundane problems too”, said Richa Singh, winner from CLC, Delhi University.

Atul Madhavan, semi- finalist from SASTRA University, Chennai says “mediation is an innovative cheaper method, it gives a sense of fulfilment that I as a law student am and will contribute to the society, a pay back to the society as a budding lawyer unlike expensive corporate solutions. Personally, I'd consider the mediation competition one of the most rewarding opportunities that RMLNLU has afforded me and also exposing students to a wealth of experience, guidance and inspiration.”.

Vice Chancellor Balraj Chauhan, RMLNLU congratulated the participating teams, and expressed his gratitude towards the judges and the member students of the legal aid committee for organizing the event and concluded with the lines “legal skills competitions such as this one are an excellent introduction for students to the demands of legal practice and such extraordinary mediatory skills in students were an overwhelming sight.”
