About the University

The late eighties saw the beginning of the tectonic shift in perceptions about law as a career -from one of the least attractive to one of the most sought-after. It was a time of hope for legal fraternity. The concept of a national institution to act as a pacesetter and a testing ground for bold experiments in legal education came up before the Bar Council of India in the context of the Council's statutory responsibility for maintaining standards in professional legal education (under the Advocates Act, 1961). **Dr Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University** was established in 2005 by the U.P. Act No. 28 of 2005 of the Government of Uttar Pradesh. It was set up on January 04, 2006, to meet the new legal challenges and strengthen the vision of establishing a national law school in Uttar Pradesh based on the pattern of national law schools in the country.

The University Grants Commission New Delhi has recognized the University under sections 2(f) and 12(b) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956. It was initially incorporated as '**Dr Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law Institute, Uttar Pradesh.**' The word 'Institute' was substituted by 'University' and later by the Amendment Act of U.P. Act No. 35 of 2006 on November 17, 2006. This was done to give a comprehensive national character to the Institute on the lines of the other premier National Law Universities of the country. The University has been receiving grants from the Government of Uttar Pradesh, which is committed to providing excellent infrastructural facilities and the best academic environment to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of the law.

The university aims to enhance the capabilities and skills of students and research scholars to create a sense of responsibility to serve society in the field of law by developing skills in advocacy, judicial and other legal services and legislation. The law must deal with problems of a diverse magnitude, and a student of law, the future Advocate, must be trained in professional skills to meet the challenges of globalization and universalizing law.

In this digital era, our society has been facing various problems and challenges due to social, economic, and political inequalities and technological challenges resulting in various disputes. It demands highly trained and skilled lawyers, judges, and legal professionals to resolve such issues. The University is well-equipped to provide legal education of higher standards to students and researchers so that they may become good lawyers and legal professionals.



Heartfelt Tribute to - Late Prof. (Dr.) Aditya Pratap Singh (1969 – 2025)



The University pays its heartfelt tribute to Late Professor Aditya Pratap Singh, Professor of Law at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow, who passed away on July 13, 2025. His untimely demise is an irreparable loss to the academic community, particularly to the field of legal education and scholarship.

Prof. Singh joined the University on June 27, 2006, as one of the founding faculty members, serving initially as Senior Lecturer in Law. Over the years, he rose through the academic ranks to become Associate Professor and later Professor of Law, dedicating nearly two decades of his life to the growth and development of the University. Throughout his tenure, he remained a deeply respected member of the academic fraternity, known for his commitment to teaching, scholarship, and mentorship.

Born on March 01, 1969, in Sultanpur District, Uttar Pradesh, Prof. Singh completed his early education at Jubilee Inter College, Lucknow. He later earned his Bachelor of Science degree from KKV Degree College, Lucknow, affiliated with the University of Lucknow, before embarking on his journey in the field of law.

Prof. Singh possessed an exceptional and interdisciplinary academic background. His qualifications included B.Sc., LL.B., LL.M., LL.D. (Doctor of Laws), and M.A. in Linguistics. His LL.D. research, titled “Semiotic Analysis of the Basic Structures and Features of the Indian Constitution,” reflected his profound engagement with semiotics, semantics, and constitutional interpretation. His work exemplified an innovative

blend of legal scholarship and linguistic inquiry.

In addition to his contributions to legal education, Prof. Singh was actively involved in the field of linguistics. He served as Visiting Faculty in the Department of Linguistics at the University of Lucknow and as Guest Faculty in Applied Linguistics at Mahatma Gandhi International Hindi University, Wardha (Bhasha Kendra, Lucknow). His interdisciplinary scholarship enriched both legal and linguistic studies.

Before joining RMLNLU, Prof. Singh served as a permanent faculty member in Law at M.M.H. College, Ghaziabad, where he contributed to undergraduate legal education. At Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, he played a pivotal role in shaping the institution during its formative years. He also served as Head of the Department of Legal Studies, providing academic leadership and guiding research and teaching initiatives.

Prof. Singh's academic interests were wide-ranging and included British Constitutional Law, Criminal Law, Semiotics, Semantics, Computational Linguistics, and Media Law. He was also associated with Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) programmes as a resource person at the University of Lucknow. His lectures and academic engagements reflected deep intellectual curiosity and a commitment to expanding the boundaries of legal scholarship.

Beyond teaching and research, Prof. Singh rendered exemplary service in various administrative and institutional roles. As Chief Proctor, he worked tirelessly to maintain discipline and ensure a safe and orderly academic environment, while addressing student concerns with fairness and empathy. His leadership contributed significantly to fostering a culture of mutual respect and responsibility within the University.

As Head of the Debate and Discussion Committee, he actively encouraged students to engage in thoughtful dialogue, critical thinking, and public discourse. Under his guidance, numerous debates, discussions, and academic events were organized, helping students develop analytical abilities and confidence. He also played an important role in nurturing the moot court culture at the University as Chairperson of Moot Court Committee. Under his leadership, university organized various international and national moot court competitions. The RMLNLU students won various national and international moot court competitions under his able and sincere guidance. He also organized various national and international conferences and seminars. Dr. Singh also did some projects for government of India and Uttar Pradesh. He contributed to the development of valuable academic resources for the University Library.

Prof. Singh's contributions extended to the broader academic community as well. He had the distinction of serving as the first President of the National Law University Teachers' Association (NALUTA), Lucknow, demonstrating his leadership and commitment to strengthening academic collaboration among law teachers.

Through his scholarship, teaching, and mentorship, Prof. Singh influenced generations of law students. His journey – from a science graduate in Lucknow to a distinguished professor and academic leader at a premier National Law University – stands as a testament to his dedication to knowledge, education, and intellectual inquiry.

Prof. Singh will be remembered not only as an accomplished scholar and teacher but also as a thoughtful mentor, principled administrator, and compassionate human being. His legacy will continue to inspire students, colleagues, and future generations of legal scholars.

The University fraternity offers its deepest condolences and pays its respectful tribute to the departed soul, praying for eternal peace. His contributions to the University and to the field of legal education will forever remain an integral part of the institution's history and legacy.

Experts **Prit Shah, Founder, Rakshaniti** – Advocates, Arbitrators & IP Attorneys and Junior Standing Counsel for Income Tax, along with **Mr. Akhil Ganatra, Associate at Economic Laws Practice (ELP)**, opened the programme by highlighting the significance of Company Secretaryship and dual qualifications in corporate governance and regulatory strategy. Subsequently, Ms. Kashish Jain provided a comprehensive overview of Judicial Clerkships, drawing from her experience at the Supreme Court of India to emphasize the critical roles of legal research, analytical rigour, and drafting skills in shaping successful careers in litigation and the judiciary.



LEGAL WRITING WORKSHOP

Visits as Part of Project ASHA

As part of Project Asha, the Legal Aid Committee, in collaboration with the Legal Services Clinic, conducted two visits to the District Jail in Lucknow on 8 October and 19 October 2025. The initiative focused on prison outreach and legal awareness for undertrial prisoners. Before the first visit, members reviewed relevant legal provisions and safeguards to ensure informed engagement. They interacted with inmates, noted concerns such as case pendency and limited legal representation, and informed them of their rights and remedies. During the second visit, joined by Para Legal Trainee Volunteers, the team addressed recurring concerns, assisted around 60 undertrial prisoners, and toured the premises.



PRE CAMP VISITS

On November 16, 2025, the Legal Aid Committee organized a Legal Aid Camp following eight pre-camp visits (29 October–14 November) in Samda and the Pyarepur divisions of Gokul Kheda, Begum Kheda, and Ajitan Kheda. During these visits, members engaged with villagers to identify issues such as ration card errors, pension concerns, sanitation problems, and electricity and water bill queries, while also raising awareness about the camp.

Held at the Panchayat Bhavan, Pyarepur, the camp served residents of Pyarepur, Dighiya, and Samda. Organized by the Legal Aid Committee and Legal Services Clinic, it included service desks from Jal Nigam Gramin, the Supply Department, and the Agriculture Department, addressing community grievances with the presence of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor and faculty members.

PROJECT SHIKSHA

Project Shiksha is an ongoing initiative of the Legal Aid Committee aimed at providing basic education and social awareness to school students through structured and creative methods. The Committee designed a curriculum covering health and hygiene, gender sensitivity, and bullying, tailored to different age groups, and finalized the adoption of a school for sustained implementation. Preliminary visits to Prathmik Vidyalay, Ajitan under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, led by faculty members, helped identify key focus areas and refine the curriculum. The project is now set for phased implementation through planned sessions.



CLIENT COUNSELLING COMPETITION

The Committee organised an Intra-University Client Counselling Competition on September 21, 2025, which received registrations from 113 teams. The selection process began with an online qualifying test, after which shortlisted teams, each comprising two counsels, advanced to the virtual mock round. The competition was assessed by 21 assessors across all stages. The competition tested participants' legal analysis, ethical awareness, and client-centric advocacy. Based on final rankings, the competition determines which teams represent the University at national Client Counselling competitions. The competition was won by Kartikey Tomar and Vani Arya from the Batch of 2030.

NEGOTIATION MEDIATION COMPETITION

The Committee organized an Intra-University Negotiation-Mediation Competition on November 22-23, 2025 with 96 participating teams, each comprising a mediator, client, and counsel. Conducted over five rounds and evaluated by 33 assessors, the competition assessed negotiation strategy, mediation skills, role fidelity, ethical judgment, and collaborative problem-solving.



The final round was judged by an expert panel to ensure professional standards. Based on cumulative performance and rankings, the event serves as a selection mechanism for representing the University at national ADR competitions. The competition concluded with a Valedictory Ceremony, where Vaneesha Bhandari and Rudraksh Singhal were named Winning Negotiators, and Pratiksha Rana was awarded Winning Mediator.

Adopt practice of self-examination

Constant learning is the difference between lawyers who merely survive and those who truly thrive, says CJI-designate

LUCKNOW: Chief Justice of India-designate Justice Surya Kant on Sunday urged young law graduates to stay curious, never stop learning and question intellectual certainties, as these qualities differentiate the lawyers who thrive and those who merely survive.

"It is the difference between lawyers who merely survive and those who truly thrive. That difference lies not in how much you know in the beginning, but in your willingness to stay curious and never stop learning," said Justice Surya Kant, who was the chief guest at convocation of Dr Ram Manohar Lohia National Law University in Lucknow.

Addressing all young graduating students to adopt the practice of self-scrutiny or self-examination as it helps professionals to prepare better before arguing a case in court, he recalled an early lesson from his own legal career.

Justice Surya Kant narrated how he once lost a seemingly straightforward dispute because of overconfidence.

"I was so sure of my position that I did not bother to revisit my draft or re-examine my arguments," he said.

"When I lost, I realised I had overlooked critical questions. That failure taught me to start from scratch every time — to review every matter carefully," he said.

"Rather than dwelling on it, I chose to learn from it. I started keeping a notebook with each case and then as advocate general of the state. What I learnt in the district court came in handy in the matter of far reaching consequences. What began as a lesson from one failure, formed the foundations of my lifelong approach. I learnt the value of constant self-examination."

He also said he had seen several lawyers who lost grip over their flourishing practice by not attending to points, which made an adverse impact on their profession.

"There will be tension when you will argue the case in the court but if you are well prepared you will withstand difficult situations," he said.

Justice Kant advocated graduating students to argue cases in

the court with confidence and conviction.

Addressing the students, he said that they have survived one of the demanding forms of professional education that consisted of late night study, the exam anxiety, the moment they questioned whether they belong to this place. He reminded students that the university bears the name of Ram Manohar Lohia, "a man who believed the most dangerous comfort is intellectual certainty."

Justice Kant added, "Lohia's legacy teaches us that growth requires the courage to ask — should it be this way, or different? Renewal begins when we dare to question." Justice Arun
